NAVARRO COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION BY-LAWS

Article I Name

Name: The name of this organization shall be the Navarro County Historical Commission, hereafter referred to as the Commission.

Article II Purpose

Purpose: The purpose of the Commission shall be to initiate and conduct programs suggested by the Texas Historical Commission; the Navarro County Commissioners Court; and members of the Commission for the preservation of the historical heritage of the county in compliance with state laws pertaining to historical preservation in Texas.

Article III Membership

- Section 1. Membership. Membership must include at least seven individuals who reside in Navarro County; otherwise it is open to any individual who has an interest in county history. Membership should represent all areas of the county and reflect the diversity of the people.
- Section 2. **Appointments.** Members are appointed by the Navarro County Historical Commission and approved by the Navarro County Commissioners Court in January of odd-numbered years and serve for a term of two years.
- Section 3. **Vacancy.** In-term vacancies may be appointed by the Navarro County Historical Commission Chairperson and will serve until the next regular appointment date.
- Section 4. **Resignation.** Any member may resign by filing a written resignation with the Chairperson, who shall in turn, inform the County Commissioners Court of such resignation in the first Annual Report following the resignation.
- Section 5. **Ex-Officio** status, non-voting members shall include the County Judge, County Commissioners and the Director of the Navarro County Historical Museum or any other organization that should be a partner of the County Historical Commission.

Section 6. **Member Emeritus** status is available to members who have made significant contributions to the Commission and who are unable for any reason to continue as active members. These members are non-voting members.

Article IV Officers

- Section 1. **Election and Term.** The officers of the Commission shall be Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. The officer's shall be elected by the Commission members. After consideration by the nominating committee outlined in Article IV, Section 7. All elected officer's terms shall be for two years.
- Section 2. Chairperson. The Chairperson shall be the Executive Officer of the Commission. His/her responsibility shall be to set the agenda, call the regular meetings and preside at those meetings; set and oversee the programs of the Commission; appoint chairperson and committees; serve as an ex-officio member of all the committees except the Nominating Committee; report annually to the County Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission; and serve on or designate a representative for any boards, commissions or committees as requested. The Chairperson shall keep all records pertaining to this office in a place so designated by the Commissioners Court.
- Section 3. **Vice-Chairperson.** The Vice-Chairperson shall preside at the meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.
- Section 4. Secretary. The Secretary shall record and keep the minutes of all meetings and perform such other duties normally pertaining to the office. The Secretary shall furnish a copy of the minutes to the Chairperson in a timely manner.
- Section 5. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall be entrusted with custody of the Commissions funds; responsible for collection of monies due to the Commission; and disbursement of funds by authority of the Commission. The Treasurer shall provide a statement of cash balance at each meeting, and an annual financial report.
- Section 6. **Records.** All elected officers and committee chairpersons shall relinquish a copy of their records to the Chairperson immediately upon the completion of their term of office or completion of a project.
- Section 7. **Nomination and Election Procedures.** Nominations for the offices of Chairman, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer shall be made by a nominating committee elected by the membership at the first regular meeting after new appointments are made in January of odd numbered years. Elections shall be held at the second regular meeting of the odd numbered year. Nominees for

office must consent to serve for a two-year term. Election shall be a voice vote unless there is more than one candidate for office, then it shall be by written ballot.

- Section 8. **Quorum.** The four officers comprise the Executive Committee. Three officers constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Executive Committee.
- Section 9. **Resignation.** An officer may resign the office while not resigning membership from the Commission by submitting a letter to the Chairperson. Vacancies occurring in any office other than the Chairperson shall be appointed for the remainder of the term by the Chairperson.

Article V Financial Administration

- Section 1. **Budget.** The proposed budget for the ensuing year shall be prepared by the Treasurer in a manner set by Commissioners Court. The budget shall be presented to the County Judge and Commissions Court.
- Section 2. Receipt of Gifts. The Commission shall be authorized to accept gifts of money; other property to further its preservation goals; and for any use in the furtherance of its lawful purposes in accordance to the Texas Local Government Code and the guidelines set by the Texas Historical Commission.

Article VI Meetings

- Section 1. Regular Meetings. There shall be a minimum of four regular meetings annually; at least one meeting will be held at the county seat. The specific date, time and place shall be set by the Chairperson. The Chairperson may call special meetings.
- Section 2. **Open Meetings.** All meetings shall be held in accordance with the Open Meeting's Act in Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.
- Section 3. **Quorum.** A majority of the Commission or one more than half the membership constitutes a quorum. A quorum must be present for the transaction of business.

Article VII Programs

Programs: The programs of the Commission shall be set by the Chairperson in accordance to Texas Local Government Code and the County Historical Commission Guidelines set by the Texas Historical Commission. As an arm of the county government, the Commission shall have authority over all Commission Programs.

Article VIII Committees

Chairperson: The Chairperson of the Commission shall appoint committee chairpersons; standing committees; and such ad hoc committees as may be necessary to perform the work of the commission.

Article IX Parliamentary Authority

Parliamentary Procedure. Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall be the authoritative reference for all procedures not covered by these By-Laws.

Article X Amendments

Amendments. These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the qualified members present at a commission meeting where there is a quorum present, provided the amendment has been submitted in writing to the general membership at least two weeks before the meeting.

INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR TAX COLLECTION

This contract is entered into between NAVARRO COUNTY, hereinafter called "County", and the CITY OF RICHLAND, hereinafter called the "City", pursuant to the provisions of Article 4413 (32c) of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes and Selections 6.23 (a) of the Property Tax Code of Texas.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this contract is to provide for the assessment and collection of ad valorem taxes on behalf of the City by the County. County agrees to assess and collect ad valorem taxes on behalf of City during the contract term, and City agrees to cooperate with County in the performance of such assessment and collections.

II. Term

This contract is to take effect and shall be for the period of <u>July 1, 2010</u>, through <u>June 30</u>, <u>2011</u>. On July 1st of each succeeding year, this contract will automatically renew. If either party wishes to cancel the automatic renewal provision of this contract, such party must give the other written notice by certified mail at least 60 days prior to the automatic renewal date of July 1st. It will be deemed that the parties' silence is affirmative acceptance of the one-year renewal and extension.

III. Limitations Designated by City

The City is a General Law B governed by its city charter and the statutes, constitution, and laws of the State of Texas.

IV. Qualified Staff

County agrees to employ qualified tax collectors and assessors as may be required from time to time by the laws of this state to assist in the performance of the obligations of County under this agreement.

V. Delinquent Tax Attorney

City will allow for the collection of delinquent taxes. County shall be responsible for supervising the efforts of any delinquent tax attorney selected by County. However, if City has a current contract with a delinquent tax attorney, that contract will be honored by County.

VI. Bonds and Deposits

The County holds a Public Employee Dishonesty Bond with an insurance company in the amount of \$50,000 per employee. The County will deposit funds as collected on a daily basis in insured accounts with local banking institutions, and will pay over collected funds to the City monthly. Any interest earned on collected funds will be the property of County.

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VII. General Requirements

County agrees to:

- A. Deliver all notices required under the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas on a timely basis on behalf of the City.
- B. Complete all reports required by the City under the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas and submit those reports to the appropriate officials on a timely basis.
- C. Insure compliance with present and future property tax calendars.
- D. Keep accurate records of all City tax collections and to make such records available for inspection during normal working hours by any authorized representative of the City, and
- E. Keep a current delinquent tax roll and to reconcile the delinquent tax roll annually.

VIII. City Records

City agrees to make available all of its assessment and collections records and to Cooperate generally with County in the performance of this agreement.

IX. Tax Certificates

County shall prepare and issue tax certificates to taxpayers on behalf of the City and shall be entitled to collect any statutory fees therefore. Any fees collected will be the property of the County.

X. Tax Assessor/Collector

The County shall be the agent for the purpose of assessing and collecting taxes of the City. In regards to the assessment and collection of taxes, County agrees to accept any reasonable direction, supervision, and requirements of the City not inconsistent with the laws of this state of County's normal operating procedures. In the performance of this agreement, County shall be deemed to be recommending actions to the City, and may take such actions as it believes appropriate and recommends from time to time unless objection is made by the City.

XI. Compensation

In exchange for its services to be rendered under this agreement, City agrees to pay County Fifty cents per parcel (\$0.50/parcel) based on previous year's parcel amounts for the City as reported by the Navarro Central Appraisal District.

XII. Computerized Records

County agrees to maintain all records regarding the assessment and collection of taxes on behalf of the City on the computer. County further agrees to provide at any reasonable time upon written request from the City, a printout reflecting the current status of the assessment and collection of taxes, within one (1) business day after such request.

XIII. Applicable Laws

This contract shall be governed by Article 4413 (32) of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes, and Sections 6.23 (a), 6.27 (b), and 6.30, as well as the other provisions of the Property Tax Code of Texas, and any other laws, rules, or statutes now existing or which may hereafter be enacted covering any part of the subject matter of this agreement. In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this agreement and any such statutory requirements, or the common law of Texas, or any provision of the Constitution of the State of Texas or the Charter for the City, the parties request any court considering same to construe this agreement in such a way as to be in compliance therewith, and in this respect hereby agree that any such inconsistent term or provision of this agreement, or any term or provision not included hereby but required by any such statute, constitutional provision, city charter, or other rule of law, shall be supplied by such court as nearly as possible so as to comply therewith and to effectuate the intent of the parties as expressed herein. - B. Complete all reports required by the School under the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas and submit those reports to the appropriate officials on a timely basis.
