

**Amendment**

The entity clicking to agree to these terms or, if applicable, signing below as customer (as applicable, "Customer") and Google Inc. 

**INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
ROCKWALL COUNTY AND NAVARRO COUNTY FOR THE  
PURCHASE AND SALE OF SECURITY EQUIPMENT**

**THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT** is made and entered into by and between Rockwall County, Texas, AND Navarro County, Texas, both of which are political subdivisions of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "Rockwall Co." and "Navarro Co.", respectively).

**WHEREAS**, the contract is made under the authority of Sections 791.001-791.029 of the Texas Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Navarro Co. desires to acquire certain property consisting of security equipment (hereinafter referred to as "Equipment") that is owned by Rockwall Co. but is no longer in use for its intended purpose; and

**WHEREAS**, Rockwall Co. desires to sell the Equipment to Navarro Co. under the authority of Section 263.152 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the governing bodies of each county find that the subject of this agreement is necessary for the benefit of the public and that each county has the legal authority to perform and to provide the governmental function or service which is the subject matter of this agreement; furthermore, the governing bodies find that the performance of this agreement is in the common interest of both parties.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, Rockwall Co. and Navarro Co. mutually agree as follows:

**GENERAL PROVISIONS**


- A. Rockwall Co. desires to sell certain pieces of security equipment to Navarro Co. that are no longer being used for their intended purposes, to wit:
1. Ranger Intelliscan 12000 (walk-through metal detector)
  2. L3 ConveyORIZED X-Ray Security Screening System
- B. Rockwall Co. warrants that it is the lawful owner in every respect of all of the described Equipment and that it is free and clear of all liens, security agreements, encumbrances, claims, demands, and charges of every kind whatsoever.
- C. Navarro Co. agrees to purchase the Equipment from Rockwall Co. for the amount of one-hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) as consideration.
- D. It shall be the responsibility of Navarro Co. to coordinate and cause the physical delivery of the Equipment from Rockwall Co. within 30 days. Rockwall Co. retains

the right to sell or otherwise dispose of the Equipment if Navarro Co. does not take possession of the Equipment within 30 days.

- E. THE EQUIPMENT IS SOLD "AS-IS" WITHOUT ANY WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AS TO THE CONDITION OF SUCH PROPERTY.
- F. This Agreement may not be altered, amended, or modified except in writing signed by all parties to this Agreement.
- G. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability will have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

### Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) Services Agreement

This Agreement outlines the terms under which American Substance Abuse Professionals, Inc., a Maryland corporation hereinafter referred to as ASAP, shall serve as the designated 'Service Agent' for Navarro County hereinafter referred to as CLIENT. The ASAP corporate address is 711 West 40<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 236, Baltimore, Maryland 21211. The corporate address for CLIENT is 300 WEST 3RD AVENUE CORBIANA TX 75110.

For purposes of this agreement, individuals referred to ASAP by CLIENT for the provision of SAP services will hereinafter be referred to as EMPLOYEE(S); regardless of their employment status at the time a referral is processed.

#### 1. Services

- a. ASAP will provide Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) services on behalf of CLIENT to all referred DOT-mandated EMPLOYEE(S).
- b. ASAP will provide referred EMPLOYEE(S) who test positive for drugs and/or alcohol on a pre-employment, random, reasonable suspicion or post accident test with a list of qualified SAPs regardless of whether or not that EMPLOYEE(S) is retained, is eligible for re-hire, is terminated or denied employment per 49 CFR Part 40, Subpart O.

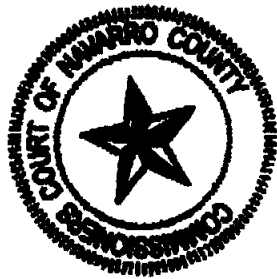
