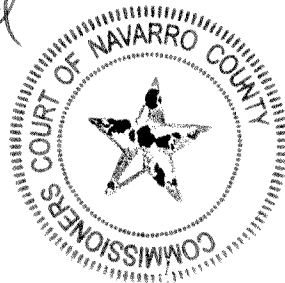

REQUIREMENTS AND PROPOSAL:

1. Navarro County owns and utilizes ES&S Ivotronic voting machines at all polling locations. In 2006, 136 voting machines were purchased with HAVA funding. The county has exclusively used these voting machines in every size election since 2006 and we feel this number of machines will adequately serve voters at all vote centers.

2. Between 2010 and 2011 Navarro County purchased a total 34 laptop computers and a dedicated server to be used along with Votec's Votesafe software. The software allows for a computerized voter registration list that meets the standard for vote centers. The 34 laptops will allow for multiple check-in locations at vote centers. Verizon hot spots will be used for internet access at all vote center locations and will allow for instantaneous verification that a voter has not already voted at another voter center location. Navarro County has successfully used the e-poll books in elections since 2010.

3. A public hearing was held during Commissioner's Court on July 28, 2014 to inform and solicit opinions from voters, minority organizations, and any other interested parties concerning the adoption of vote centers. An electronic recording of the hearing is included with this submission. The Court voted in favor of adopting Countywide Vote Centers for Navarro County.

Navarro County proposes opening 20 vote centers. Upon approval from the Secretary of State's Office, vote centers will be used in the November 4, 2014 Election. If deemed successful, vote centers will be used in future elections. There were 30 polling locations used in previous elections; therefore, the county will meet the 65% vote center requirement.

Prior to the public hearing, a Vote Center Advisory Committee was formed to solicit opinions on vote center locations and the communication plan to notify voters of the changes in polling locations. The committee was made up of community leaders and representatives of entities with which the county holds joint elections. A list has been included with the names of the members of the Advisory Committee.

Included with this submission, are letters that have been received from community members regarding the vote center proposal.

SITE SELECTION:

Voting history, feedback from the community as well as a site survey to determine compliance with the following criteria were used in determining the final voter center locations:

- 1. Familiarity to Voters
 - A. Prior use as a polling location
 - B. Familiarity within the community
- 2. Ease of Access
 - A. Ground level entrance
 - B. Adequate parking
 - C. ADA compliance
 - D. Visibility
- 3. Space Requirements
 - A. Supports voters
 - B. Supports equipment
 - C. Supports staffing

16 of the 20 vote center sites that will be used are current polling locations. 3 sites are being moved to locations that will better suit vote center style voting. There will be a vote center open in each rural city in Navarro County.

Communication Plan:

The communication plan to inform voters of the changes that will occur with the transition to vote centers include as follows:

- 1. Direct mail flyers sent to all Navarro County households with registered voters in both English and Spanish.
- 2. Flyers will be sent to city offices, city libraries, and chambers of commerce for distribution at their locations
- 3. Phone lines set up prior to and on Election Day staffed for voter and election worker questions.

4. Information posted on the county website
5. Notices will be published in the local newspaper
6. Radio/TV public service announcements
7. Post vote center information at all former polling locations that will not be open on election day
8. Large "Vote Here" banner will be displayed at all vote centers

In the past, the Elections Administrator has contracted with both political parties to hold joint Primary Elections. Both parties have agreed to continue to hold joint elections under the new vote center proposal.

All entities are in agreement that election officials will continue to be appointed according to the same list procedure as Election Day judges and clerks as done prior to vote center voting. The political parties submit their lists in writing to the Commissioner's Court and appointments are currently made for two year terms, pursuant to Election Code 32.002

Navarro County agrees to submit their specific findings after each election held with countywide precincts to the Office of the Secretary of State.

Thank you for considering to allow Navarro County to participate in countywide vote centers.

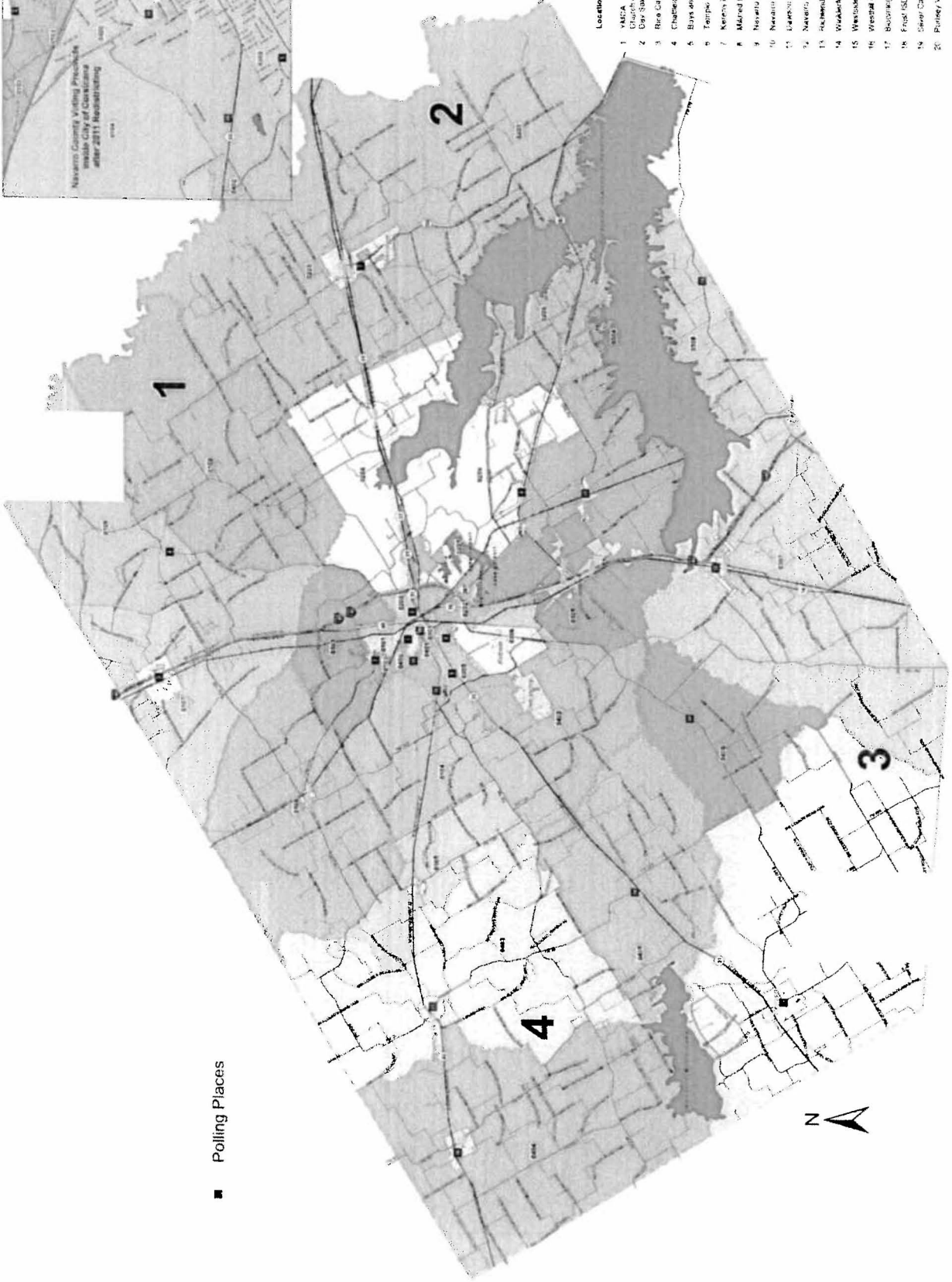
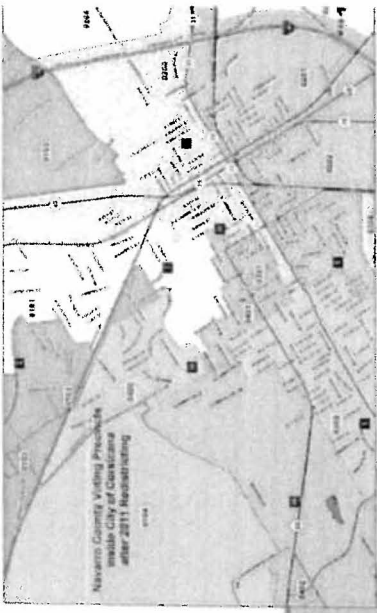
Thank you for your work on the new Voter Center system for which we held a public hearing in Commissioners Court July 28, 2014.

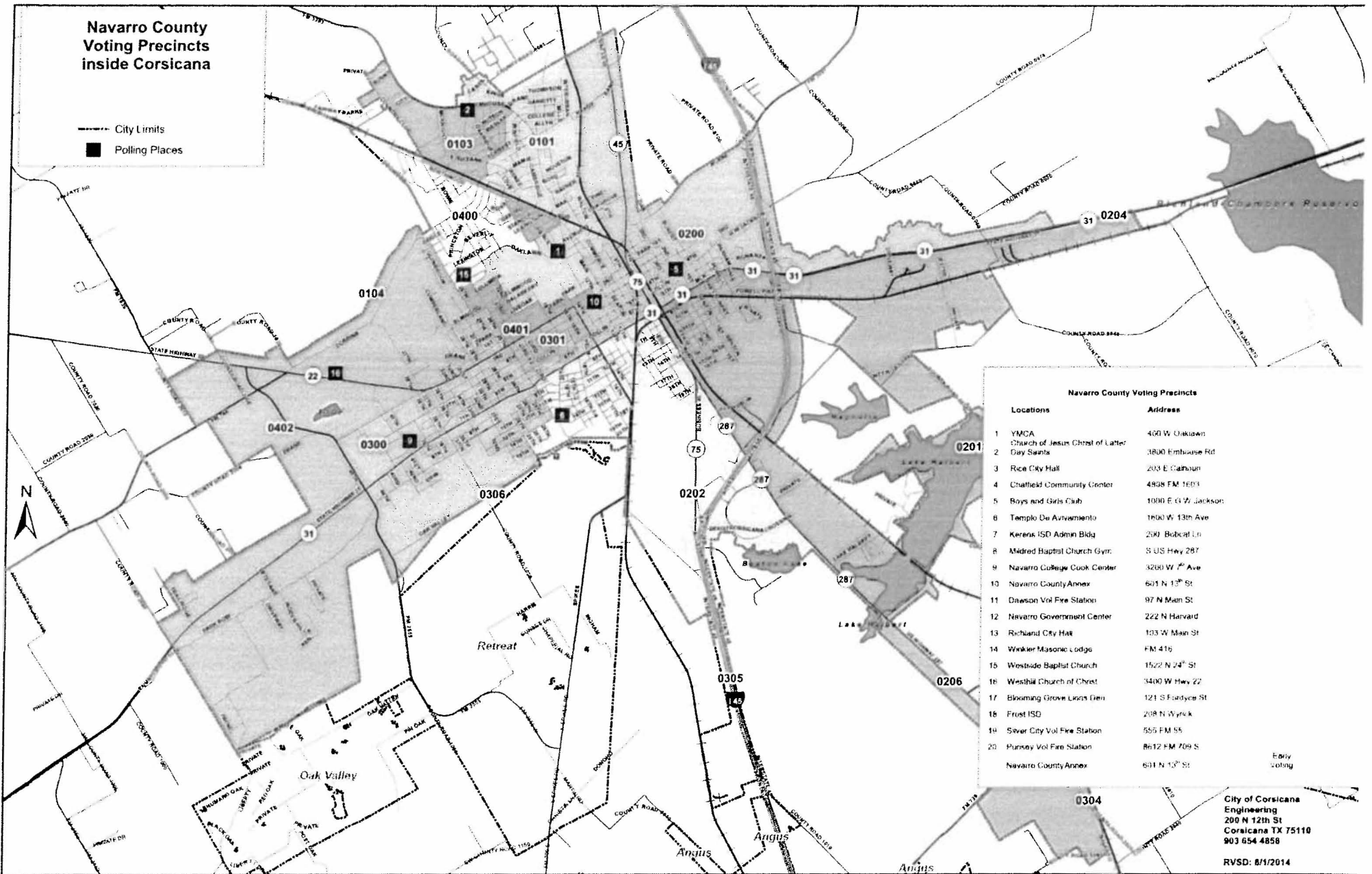

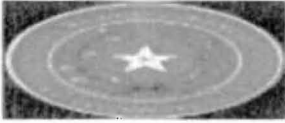

When we tell them they have to go to their precinct, reactions range from confusion to disgust to anger. Many comment that they will be unable to vote due to lack of time to reach the proper place. On every voting day we will have twice as many we have to send elsewhere as actual voters from our precinct.

We feel that voting centers allowing people to vote at any polling place in the county would be of great benefit to the people of Navarro County. Thank you for your consideration.

Thank you for allowing me to comment upon the recent article dated July 24 in the Corsicana Daily Sun, regarding the proposed elimination of 9 of 30 precinct polling places and the formation of county-wide voting centers. With about half of my precinct members voting early, before Election Day, there has not been any last minute waiting in line as described in the newspaper article.

Since Navarro College Cook Center will continue to serve as a polling place, the new proposal will have minimum impact upon my precinct. In fact, Precinct 300 will have two voting centers, with the inclusion of Tempelo de Avivamiento. Since Navarro College possesses a large concentration of students and faculty, both day and evening, I would expect a greater number of people voting at the Cook Center on Election Day.

Although the voting center proposal may be more convenient for the voter logistics, not having to return to their precinct, there are new challenges for election workers and administrators. I question the internet central database would completely prevent voter fraud, because multiple voting locations would be more vulnerable to false ID's, than a single polling place. Having served as an election judge for 20+ years, I have built a relationship my precinct voters, where the person would be remembered if they had voted. Election workers will need to check photo ID's closer, to ensure the photograph matches the person, for integrity in the voter qualification process.

Also, if there were a problem with the computer laptop or central database, then a hardcopy list of registered voters would be required for the entire county, as a back-up. Often there are problems with voter name look-up, and the VUID (voter unique identification number) must be referenced from the precinct hardcopy list and inputted into the laptop. A county-wide list would be very cumbersome to fit into the blue carrying bags and indexed for voter look-up. In the May 10 city & school board elections and the May 27 primary run-off election, with consolidated precincts, the laptops could not be programmed for all the county elections occurring that day, requiring stamping the hardcopy list of registered voters' method.

Another challenge is the Votronix voting machines must be programmed with as many as four different precinct ballots. If it is a primary election, there would be at least two political parties, equating to eight different ballots to be available in each of the voting centers. Most voters do not know what precinct they live in. Election workers will need to need to rely upon the database and communicate with each other, to ensure the correct ballot is selected for the voter's precinct.

With a greater reliance upon technology, it is difficult to recruit election workers whom are willing and proficient using the computer laptop and the Votronix voting machines. The Navarro County budget is tight and fewer polling places would cost less money. The newspaper article did not disclose the reason for closing certain precinct polling places. Some of the smaller "ballot boxes" in the rural county cannot staff their own polling place, therefore other election workers must be brought from elsewhere in the county.

The proposal eliminated the Precinct 205 polling place, which was surprising, since it is one of the larger "ballot boxes" in the county – and growing with the Richland Chambers Lake development. Yet, I recognize the difficulty of finding suitable buildings for the proposed voting centers. Since the election supplies and voting machines are delivered to the precinct polling place the day before the election and must be stored overnight, there are building access and security issues to be considered.

When drawing precinct lines and establishing polling places / voting centers, we should think in terms of communities. Polling places should be located closest to the voter residences. People know where to vote in their community on Election Day. If they lose their polling place, they may not know where the nearest voting center is, and will come vote early at the Courthouse Annex anyway. Some people, especially the elderly, may not be willing to drive an extra 5 miles to vote in another community.

In summary, there are advantages and disadvantages to the voting center proposal. The central database system favors voters whom commute within the county, and fewer polling places would save the county money. However, closing 9 of 30 polling places would also inconvenience voters, cause confusion, and discourage community political organization. The voting equipment and central database must be maintained.

With early voting held two weeks prior and the weekend prior to Election Day, there really is no excuse not to vote. The proposal will not increase voter turn-out.


I agree with the idea of reducing the election day polling places.

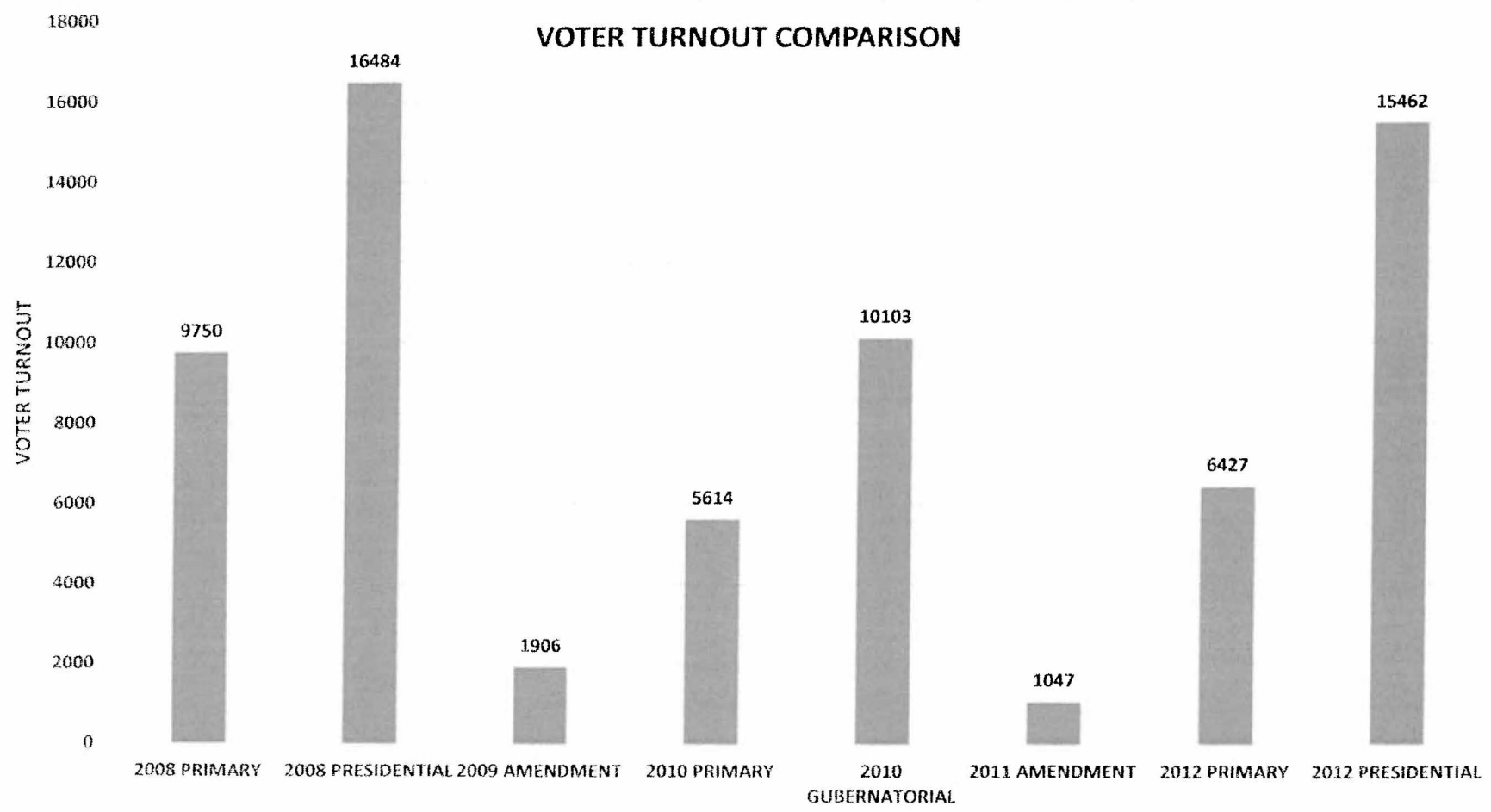

Corsicana — It's not unusual for voters to suddenly rush into the courthouse on election night right before the 7 p.m. cutoff, only to be turned away, unable to vote because their precinct is too far away to make it before the polls close.

That could become a thing of the past, though. Navarro County is applying to the state to allow county-wide voting, which lets voters cast a ballot at any polling place, regardless of an individual's home precinct.

"So, if you're working in town and your polling location is in Kerens, you can still get off and go vote here in Corsicana," said Danda Parker, elections administrator for Navarro County.

Each of the polling sites, called election centers, is linked to a central database, so any site can pull up any voter's name. The database will also tell if a voter has cast a ballot in that election yet, eliminating voter fraud.

Because every site is every precinct, it also means fewer polling locations, which can cause a little confusion at first.

Williamson County, just north of Austin, has had county-wide voting since May 2013, and it's been well received by voters and poll workers there, said Jason Barnett, elections administrator for Williamson County.

"We do exit polling, and anywhere between 92 and 97 percent of those who responded say the convenience factor has improved the experience the voter has," Barnett said.

County-wide voting also virtually eliminates provisional ballots. Provisional ballots are when voters who went to the wrong precinct, or who didn't show up on a precinct list, are allowed to fill out a ballot, which is kept separate. Provisional ballots are often not counted.

"From an administrative perspective, it's much easier," Barnett said. "With the ability to allow voters to vote anywhere on election day, it just makes it easier for everybody all around. From my office's perspective, the poll workers' perspective, or the voters' perspective. They all love voting centers."

Parker said she hadn't heard any negative comments about the concept, either. If there's a downside, it's that there are fewer polling locations. In Navarro County, the proposal would take the county from 30 individual voting sites to 21 consolidated sites. A hearing to collect comments on the overall idea, as well as the polling locations will take place at the commissioners' court meeting at 10 a.m. Monday.

"Monday is the public hearing. We just want the good and bad, whatever people have to say on it," Parker said.

The polling places that would be eliminated from the list include the Lone Star Cowboy Church, Barry Methodist Church, Emhouse Community Center, Roane Baptist Church, Powell Volunteer Fire Department, Eureka Methodist Church, Angus City Hall, Retreat City Hall.

Proposed new voting sites are the Boys and Girls Club in Corsicana, Tempelo de Avivamiento, Mildred Baptist Church, and the Blooming Grove Lions Den.

The new courthouse annex, which was the Corsicana ISD administration building, will also be a voting center, and that's where early voting will take place, also.

"It cuts down the polling locations from 30 to 21, but you can go to any polling location we have. For instance, here at the courthouse people come up here all day long (on election day), and the last time we counted 75 people turned away. About 25 of them got to vote."

If the state approves of the county's application, the first county-wide voting would take place during the general election in November.

Consent Agenda approved

Commissioners approved items on the consent agenda, including minutes of previous meetings and budget transfers for the sheriff's office.

Burn Ban discussed

No action was taken on establishing a burn ban for the county, but County Judge H.M. Davenport Jr. said he would act if needed should conditions worsen and no rain is forthcoming.

Countywide Voting discussed

A public hearing to establish consolidated polling places in Navarro County was held Monday. The proposal allows for voters to make use of any polling place in the county with electronic controls to help prevent voter fraud. The move would also reduce the total number of polling places in the county. Commissioner James Olsen said the move was "more of a convenience than a restriction," and Commissioner Dick Martin said after getting used to a change in his own voting precinct a few years ago, it would be a good move for the county. "It's going to be really nice," he said. "Of all the counties I've talked to, they love it," said Elections Coordinator Danda Parker. "They've not had any problems." Corsicana City Councilwoman Ruby Williams said closing down voting places is a concern. Said she will be looking into it to see if it is "feasible."

Historical Commission presentation

HIDTA contract changed OK'd

Commissioners approved modifications to a grant for the HIDTA program it serves as the "pass-through" agency for funding.

Kerens ISD tax contract accepted

The Navarro County Tax Assessor/Collector's office will

be collecting taxes for the Kerens ISD, with the contract approved by the KISD trustees last week, and adopted by commissioners Monday.

Appraisal role accepted

Tax Assessor/Collector Russell Hudson presented commissioners with the 2014 Certified Appraisal Roll and Anticipated Collection Rate. Hudson certified a collection rate at 100 percent.

Annex A/C unit added to maintenance contract

Commissioners approved adding a unit at the Annex property to the maintenance agreement with Lochridge-Priest.

Payment card processing agreement OK'd

Commissioners approved an agreement for payment processing for items e-filed with the county and district clerk's offices. The e-filing program is to begin in October, said County Clerk Sherry Dowd.

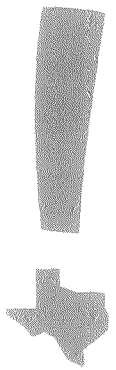

INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR TAX COLLECTION

This contract is entered into between NAVARRO COUNTY, hereinafter called "County", and KERENS ISD, hereinafter called the "School", pursuant to the provisions of Article 4413 (32c) of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes and Selections 6.23 (a) of the Property Tax Code of Texas.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this contract is to provide for the assessment and collection of ad valorem taxes on behalf of the School by the County. County agrees to assess and collect ad valorem taxes on behalf of School during the contract term, and School agrees to cooperate with County in the performance of such assessment and collections.

II. Term

This contract is to take effect and shall be for the period of July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014. On July 1st of each succeeding year, this contract will automatically renew. If either party wishes to cancel the automatic renewal provision of this contract, such party must give the other written notice by certified mail at least 60 days prior to the automatic renewal date of July 1st. It will be deemed that the parties' silence is affirmative acceptance of the one-year renewal and extension.

III. Limitations Designated by School

The School is governed by the statutes, constitution, and laws of the State of Texas.

IV. Qualified Staff

County agrees to employ qualified tax collectors and assessors as may be required from time to time by the laws of this state to assist in the performance of the obligations of County under this agreement.

V. Delinquent Tax Attorney

School will allow for the collection of delinquent taxes. County shall be responsible for supervising the efforts of any delinquent tax attorney selected by County. However, if School has a current contract with a delinquent tax attorney, that contract will be honored by County.

VI. Bonds and Deposits

The County agrees to maintain Public Employee Dishonesty Bond Insurance in the amount of \$50,000 per employee. The County will deposit funds as collected on a daily basis in insured accounts with local banking institutions, and will pay funds weekly by check unless other arrangements are agreed upon by both parties. Any interest earned on collected funds while in the County depository will be the property of the County.

VII. General Requirements

County agrees to:

- A. Deliver all notices required under the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas on a timely basis on behalf of the School.
- B. Complete all reports required by the School under the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas and submit those reports to the appropriate officials on a timely basis.
- C. Insure compliance with present and future property tax calendars.
- D. Keep accurate records of all School tax collections and to make such records available for inspection during normal working hours by any authorized representative of the School, and
- E. Keep a current delinquent tax roll and to reconcile the delinquent tax roll annually.

VIII. School Records and Tax Rate

School will assume responsibility of annually determining and calculating its effective tax rate (ETR) and proposed tax rate (PTR) and will publish notices regarding such in appropriate newspaper or publication as required by law. School will furnish a copy of the ETR and PTR with backup to the County for auditing purposes. County Tax Assessor-Collector shall certify Schools ETR and PTR in accordance with the law, only after School has provided County with all worksheets and supporting data used by School in calculating ETR and PTR and County Tax Assessor-Collector shall immediately notify School of such and both parties shall use all reasonable efforts to resolve the calculations in a favorable manner in accordance with the law. School shall hold harmless and indemnify County from any liability related to School's failure to properly calculate, determine and/or publish the ETR or PTR.

IX. Tax Certificates

County shall prepare and issue tax certificates to taxpayers on behalf of the School and shall be entitled to collect any statutory fees therefore. Any fees collected will be the property of the County.

X. Tax Assessor/Collector

The County shall be the agent for the purpose of assessing and collecting taxes of the School. In regards to the assessment and collection of taxes, County agrees to accept any reasonable direction, supervision, and requirements of the School not inconsistent with the laws of this state of County's normal operating procedures. In the performance of this agreement, County shall be deemed to be recommending actions to the School, and may take such actions as it believes appropriate and recommends from time to time unless objection is made by the School.

XI. Compensation

In exchange for its services to be rendered under this agreement, School agrees to pay County Forty One cents per parcel (\$0.41/parcel) based on previous year's parcel amounts for the School as reported by the Navarro Central Appraisal District.

XII. Computerized Records


County agrees to maintain all records regarding the assessment and collection of taxes on behalf of the School with periodic back up of data via hard copy or disc safely stored in accordance with the County and School regulations and State law. County further agrees to provide at any reasonable time upon written request from the School, a printout reflecting the current status of the assessment and collection of taxes, within one (1) business day after such request.

XIII. Applicable Laws


This contract shall be governed by Article 4413 (32) of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes, and Sections 6.23 (a), 6.27 (b), and 6.30, as well as the other provisions of the Property Tax Code of Texas, and any other laws, rules, or statutes now existing or which may hereafter be enacted covering any part of the subject matter of this agreement. In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this agreement and any such statutory requirements, or the common law of Texas, or any provision of the Constitution of the State of Texas, the parties request any court considering same to construe this agreement in such a way as to be in compliance therewith, and in this respect hereby agree that any such inconsistent term or provision of this agreement, or any term or provision not included hereby but required by any such statute, constitutional provision, or other rule of law, shall be supplied by such court as nearly as possible so as to comply therewith and to effectuate the intent of the parties as expressed herein. In the event of any contention that the charges made hereunder exceed those allowed by Section 6.27 (b) of the Property Tax Code, a fair and reasonable portion of general overhead and operating expense of County shall be allocated in determining such matters.



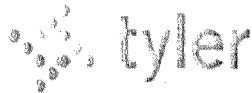

WHEREAS, Tyler and the Texas Office of Court Administration ("OCA") have entered into a certain Electronic Filing Agreement dated November 8, 2012 (the "eFile Agreement") whereby Tyler has made available to Court Tyler's electronic filing system, and

WHEREAS, through the said electronic filing system, certain Registered Users may submit payment for statutory courts costs and fees through the eFile System provided Court is enrolled in a Court Payment Card Processing Participation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Tyler has contracted with a national banking association ("Member"), a payment processor ("Processor"), and others, to provide services under this Processing Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Member is a member of several Associations, including but not limited to Visa and MasterCard; and

WHEREAS, through Member, Tyler is authorized to process the Card Transactions listed on Schedule 1; and

WHEREAS, Tyler shall submit Transactions on behalf of Court in accordance with Association Rules.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises made and the mutual benefits to be derived from this Processing Agreement, Tyler and Court agree as follows:

A. Tyler shall furnish the services described in this Processing Agreement.

B. This Processing Agreement consists of this cover and signature page and the following attachments and exhibits attached hereto and to be attached throughout the Term of this Processing Agreement, all of which are incorporated by reference herein

Merchant Payment Card Processing Agreement Terms and Conditions

1. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

1.1. By executing this Processing Agreement, Court is contracting with Tyler to obtain Card processing services on Court's behalf.

1.2. Court acknowledges that Tyler contracts with a payment processor (a "Processor"), Members, and other third party providers to provide services under this Processing Agreement, and Court hereby consents to the use of such Processor, Members, and others to provide such services.

1.3. Any terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the same meaning as provided in the eFile Agreement which is incorporated herein by reference.

1.4. Court shall complete an application with the Member with which Tyler has contracted, and execute an agreement with such Member (the "Member Bank Agreement"). By executing the Member Bank Agreement, Court is fulfilling the Association Rule of entering into a direct contractual relationship with a Member, and Court agrees to comply with Association Rules as they pertain to Transactions submitted for processing through the Tyler service. For purposes of processing Transaction hereunder, it is understood and agreed that references to "Merchant" herein and/or in the Member Bank Agreement are intended to mean the Court.

1.5. Court acknowledges that Tyler may have agreed to be responsible for Court's obligations to a Member for such Transactions as set forth in the Member Bank Agreement. Tyler shall be entitled to invoice Court for any fees, charges, debits or costs actually paid by Tyler arising out of any claim, complaint, or Chargeback made or claimed by a Cardholder with respect to any Transactions submitted by Court.

2. SETTLEMENT AND CHARGEBACKS

2.1. Merchant Bank Account. In order to receive funds, Court must maintain a bank account (the "Merchant Bank Account") at a bank that is a member of the Automated Clearing House ("ACH") system and the Federal Reserve wire system. Court agrees not to close the Merchant Bank Account without giving Tyler at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice and substituting another bank account. Court is solely liable for all fees and costs associated with Merchant Bank Account and for all overdrafts. Tyler shall not be liable for any delays in receipt of funds or errors in bank account entries caused by third parties, including but not limited to delays or errors by the Member Bank or payment processor to Merchant Bank Account.

2.2. Settlement. Transactions shall be settled according to the terms of the Member Bank Agreement using the account(s) which are designated by Court.

2.3. Retrieval Requests. Court is required by the Associations to store original documentation, and to timely respond to Retrieval Requests, of each Transaction for at least six months from the date of the respective Transaction, and to retain copies of all such data for at least 18 months from the date of the respective Transaction. Court is responsible for any Chargebacks that result from Court's failure to timely respond to Retrieval Requests for documentation relating to a Transaction.

3. FEES AND INVOICING

3.1. Processing Fees. Court agrees that Tyler may assess the Processing Fees set forth in Schedule 1 for services provided by Tyler in accordance with this Agreement. For payments that are initiated through the eFiling System, a convenience fee will be assessed to the consumer for each payment transaction that is paid electronically using a credit or debit card. The convenience fee will be charged at the time of the transaction and will be deposited directly into a Tyler Technologies bank account from which all fees associated with processing and settling the transactions, except Other Fees as provided herein, will be paid.

3.2. Adjustments to Pricing. Tyler may modify the pricing on Schedule 1 with thirty (30) days' prior written notice. In addition, by giving written notice to Court, Tyler may change Court's fees, charges and discounts resulting from (i) changes in Association fees (such as interchange, assessments and other charges) or (ii) changes in pricing by any third party provider of a product or service used by Court. Such new prices shall be applicable as of the effective date established by the Association or third party provider, or as of any later date specified in Tyler's notice to Court.

3.3. Other Fees. In the event of a Chargeback by a consumer, the amount of any disputed charge may be deducted by the Member Bank from Court's Member Bank Account pursuant to the Member Bank Agreement. In such event, Tyler may additionally assess to the Court the chargeback fee listed in Schedule 1. If instead of deducting funds from Court's Merchant Account, the Member assess chargebacks, claims or disputed sums to Tyler, Tyler shall invoice the same to the Court as Other Fees hereunder.

4. THIRD PARTY PROVIDERS

Tyler may, in its sole discretion, contract with alternate Members, payment processors or other third party providers to provide services under this Processing Agreement. In such event, Court shall reasonably cooperate with Tyler, including the execution of a new Member Bank Agreement by Court; provided, however, that if the terms and conditions of the new Member Bank Agreement are substantially different than Court's existing Member Bank Agreement, then Court shall have the right to terminate this Processing Agreement.

5. TYLER CONFIDENTIAL AND PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

5.1. Protection of Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information. Court shall not disclose, disseminate, transmit, publish, distribute, make available, or otherwise convey Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information, and Court shall not use, make, sell, or otherwise exploit any such Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information for any purpose other than the performance of this Processing Agreement, without Tyler's written consent, except: (a) as may be required by law, regulation, judicial, or administrative process; or (b) as required in litigation pertaining to this Processing Agreement, provided that Tyler is given advance notice of such intended disclosure in order to permit it the opportunity to seek a protective order. Court shall ensure that all individuals assigned to perform services herein shall abide by the terms of this Section 5.1 and shall be responsible for breaches by such persons.

5.2. Judicial Proceedings. If Court is requested or required (by oral questions, interrogatories, requests for information or documents in legal proceedings, subpoena, civil investigative demand, or other similar process) to disclose any Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information, Court shall provide Tyler with prompt written notice of such request or requirement so that Tyler may seek protective orders or other appropriate remedies and/or waive compliance with the provisions of this Processing Agreement. If, in the absence of a protective order or other remedy or the receipt of a waiver by Tyler, Court nonetheless is legally compelled to disclose Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information to any court or tribunal or else would stand liable for contempt or suffer other censure or penalty, Court may, without liability herein, disclose to such court or tribunal only that portion of Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information which the court requires to be disclosed, provided that Court uses reasonable efforts to preserve the confidentiality of Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information, including, without limitation, by cooperating with Tyler to obtain an appropriate protective order or other reliable assurance that confidential treatment shall be accorded Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information.

6. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

6.1. Compliance with Laws. In performing this Processing Agreement, Tyler shall comply with all applicable material licenses, legal certifications, or inspections. Tyler shall also comply in all material respects with applicable federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.

6.2. Certain Business Practices. Neither Tyler nor any of its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participating in this Processing Agreement by any federal department or agency. Tyler further represents and warrants that it is not listed on any local, state or federal consolidated list of debarred, suspended, and ineligible contractors and grantees. No person (other than permanent employees of Tyler) has been engaged or retained by Tyler to solicit, procure, receive, accept, arrange, or secure this Processing Agreement for any compensation, consideration, or value.

7. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

TYLER'S LIABILITY TO COURT FOR DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS PROCESSING AGREEMENT, WHETHER BASED ON A THEORY OF CONTRACT OR TORT, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE AND STRICT LIABILITY, SHALL BE LIMITED TO THE TOTAL FEES PAID TO TYLER UNDER THIS PROCESSING AGREEMENT (NET OF ASSOCIATION INTERCHANGE, ASSESSMENTS AND FINES) FOR THE SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO THE TIME THE LIABILITY AROSE.

WHILE BOTH PARTIES ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THIS IS AN AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES TO WHICH THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE DOES NOT APPLY, IN NO EVENT SHALL TYLER BE LIABLE FOR INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, OR SPECIAL DAMAGES OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, LOST REVENUES OR PROFITS, OR LOSS OF BUSINESS OR LOSS OF DATA ARISING OUT OF THIS PROCESSING AGREEMENT, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THE PARTIES HAVE ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGE.

8. TAXES

8.1. Tax Exempt Status. Court is a governmental tax-exempt entity and shall not be responsible for any taxes for any Licensed Property or services provided for herein, whether federal or state. The fees paid to Tyler pursuant to this Processing Agreement are inclusive of any applicable sales, use, personal property, or other taxes attributable to periods on or after the Effective Date of this Processing Agreement.

8.2. Employee Tax Obligations. Each party accepts full and exclusive liability for the payment of any and all contributions or taxes for Social Security, Workers' Compensation Insurance, Unemployment Insurance, or Retirement Benefits, Pensions, or annuities now or hereafter imposed pursuant to or arising from any state or federal laws which are measured by the wages, salaries, or other remuneration pay to persons employed by such party for work performed under this Processing Agreement.

9. TERM, SUSPENSION, AND TERMINATION

9.1. Term. The term of this Processing Agreement (the "Term") shall commence on the Effective Date hereof and shall continue in effect for three years; provided, however, that at the end of such initial term, and on each subsequent anniversary of the Effective Date, the term shall automatically extend for an additional year unless either party provides, at least ninety (90) days prior to the end of the then current term, written notice that it does not wish to extend the term or otherwise terminates the agreement for Cause pursuant to Section 9.2.

9.2. Termination for Cause. Either party may terminate this Processing Agreement for Cause, provided that such party follows the procedures set forth in this Section 9.2.

(a) For purposes of this Section, "Cause" means either:

- (i) a material breach of this Processing Agreement, which has not been cured within ninety (90) days of the date such party receives written notice of such breach;
- (ii) if Tyler services provided under this Processing Agreement fail to conform to generally accepted standards for such services in the Card processing industry and, after ninety (90) days written notice, Tyler does not rectify its failure of performance;
- (iii) the failure by Court to timely pay when due any fees owed to Tyler pursuant to this Processing Agreement and any delinquent amounts remain outstanding for a period of thirty (30) days after Tyler provides written notice of its intent to terminate for failure to pay;
- (iv) breach of Section 5; or
- (v) if Tyler becomes insolvent or bankrupt, or is the subject of any proceedings relating to its liquidation or insolvency or for the appointment of a receiver or similar officer for it, has a receiver of its assets or property appointed or makes an assignment for the benefit of all or substantially all of its creditors, or institutes or causes to be instituted any proceeding in bankruptcy or reorganization or rearrangement of its affairs.

(b) No party may terminate this Processing Agreement under Section 9.2(a)(i) unless it cooperates in good faith with the alleged

breaching party during the cure period and complies in good faith with the dispute resolution procedures set forth in Section 10 following such period.

(c) In the event either party terminates this Processing Agreement pursuant to this Section 9.2, each party shall return all products, documentation, confidential information, and other information disclosed or otherwise delivered to the other party prior to such termination, all revocable licenses shall terminate.

9.3. Survival. The following provisions shall survive after the Term of this Processing Agreement: 5; 7; 8; **Error! Reference source not found.** 10, 11 and 12.

10. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any dispute arising out of, or relating to, this Processing Agreement that cannot be resolved within five (5) Business Days shall be referred to the individual reasonably designated by Court and Tyler's Vice President of Courts and Justice Systems Division assigned to Court's account ("Intermediary Dispute Level"). Any dispute that cannot be resolved in ten (10) Business Days at the Intermediary Dispute Level shall then be referred to Court's chief executive officer or other individual reasonably designated by Court and Tyler's President of Courts and Justice Systems Division ("Executive Dispute Level"), at such time and location reasonably designated by the parties. Any negotiations pursuant to this Section are confidential and shall be treated as compromise and settlement negotiations for purposes of the applicable rules of evidence. For any dispute that the parties are unable to resolve through informal discussions or negotiations or pursuant to the dispute resolution and escalation procedures set forth in this Processing Agreement, the parties shall submit the matter to non-binding mediation. The foregoing shall not apply to claims for equitable relief under Section 7.

11. MISCELLANEOUS

11.1. Assignment. Neither party may assign this Processing Agreement or any of its respective rights or obligations herein to any third party without the express written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

11.2. Notices. Except as otherwise expressly specified herein, all notices, requests or other communications shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or mailed, by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the parties at their respective addresses set forth on the signature page hereto, or at such other addresses as may be specified in writing by either of the parties. All notices, requests, or communications shall be deemed effective upon personal delivery or three (3) days following deposit in the mail.

11.3. Waiver. The performance of any obligation required of a party herein may be waived only by a written waiver signed by the other party, which waiver shall be effective only with respect to the specific obligation described therein.

11.4. Entire Agreement. This Processing Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and contract between the parties and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous oral or written representations or communications with respect to the subject matter hereof.

11.5. Amendment. This Processing Agreement shall not be modified, amended, or in any way altered except by an instrument in writing signed by the properly delegated authority of each party. All amendments or modifications of this Processing Agreement shall be binding upon the parties despite any lack of consideration.

11.6. Severability of Provisions. In the event any provision hereof is found invalid or unenforceable pursuant to judicial decree, the remainder of this Processing Agreement shall remain valid and enforceable according to its terms.

11.7. Relationship of Parties. The parties intend that the relationship between the parties created pursuant to or arising from this Processing Agreement is that of an independent contractor only. Neither party shall be considered an agent, representative, or employee of the other party for any purpose.

11.8. Governing Law. Any dispute arising out of or relating to this Processing Agreement or the breach thereof shall be governed by the laws of the state of Texas, without regard to or application of choice of law rules or principles.

11.9. Audit. Tyler shall maintain complete and accurate records of all work performed pursuant to and arising out of this Processing Agreement.

Court may, upon the written request, audit any and all records of Tyler relating to services provided herein. Court shall provide Tyler twenty-four hour notice of such audit or inspection. Tyler shall have the right to exclude from such inspection any Tyler Confidential and Proprietary Information not otherwise required to be provided to Court as a part of this Processing Agreement. Tyler shall make such books and records available to Court during normal business hours. Any such audit shall be conducted at Tyler's principal place of business during Tyler's normal business hours and at Court's sole expense.

11.10. No Third Party Beneficiaries. Nothing in this Processing Agreement is intended to benefit, create any rights in, or otherwise vest any rights upon any third party.

11.11. Force Majeure. No party to this Processing Agreement shall be liable for delay or failure in the performance of its contractual obligations arising from any one or more events that are beyond its reasonable control, including, without limitation, acts of God, war, terrorism, and riot. Upon such delay or failure affecting one party, that party shall notify the other party and use all reasonable efforts to cure or alleviate the cause of such delay or failure with a view to resuming performance of its contractual obligations as soon as practicable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in every case the delay or failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the party claiming excusable delay. Any performance times pursuant to or arising from this Processing Agreement shall be considered extended for a period of time equivalent to the time lost because of any delay that is excusable herein.

11.12. Equitable Relief. Each party covenants, represents, and warrants that any violation of this Processing Agreement by such party with respect to its respective obligations set forth in Section 5 shall cause irreparable injury to the other party and shall entitle the other party to extraordinary and equitable relief by a court of competent jurisdiction, including, without limitation, temporary restraining orders and preliminary and permanent injunctions, without the necessity of posting bond or security.

12. CERTAIN DEFINITIONS

12.1. Retrieval Request means a request for information by a Cardholder or Card issuer relating to a claim or complaint concerning a Card sale Court has made.

12.2. Transaction means the evidence and electronic record of a sale or lease transaction representing payment by use of a Card or of a refund/credit to a Cardholder.

12.3. D. Repair Persons: Repairs must be completed by trained, qualified, and insured repair persons.

- E. HVAC Service Contract: If Tenant maintains the HVAC system under Paragraph 15C(12), Tenant is is not required to maintain, at its expense, a regularly scheduled maintenance and service contract for the HVAC system. If Tenant fails to repair or maintain an item for which Tenant is responsible within 10 days after Landlord provides Tenant written notice of the needed repair or maintenance, Landlord may: (1) repair or maintain the item, without liability for any damage or loss to Tenant, and Tenant must immediately reimburse Landlord for the cost to repair or maintain; or (2) exercise Landlord's remedies under Paragraph 20.

16. ALTERATIONS:

- A. Tenant may not alter (including making any penetrations to the roof, exterior walls or foundation), improve, or add to the Property or the leased premises without Landlord's written consent. Landlord will not unreasonably withhold consent for the Tenant to make reasonable non-structural alterations, modifications, or improvements to the leased premises.
- B. Tenant may not alter any locks or any security devices on the Property or the leased premises without Landlord's consent. If Landlord authorizes the changing, addition, or rekeying of any locks or other security devices, Tenant must immediately deliver the new keys and access devices to Landlord.
- C. If a governmental order requires alteration or modification to the leased premises, the party obligated to maintain and repair the item to be modified or altered as designated in Paragraph 15 will, at its expense, modify or alter the item in compliance with the order and in compliance with Paragraphs 16A and 17.
- D. Any alterations, improvements, fixtures or additions to the Property or leased premises installed by either party during the term of this lease will become Landlord's property and must be surrendered to Landlord at the time this lease ends, except for those fixtures Landlord requires Tenant to remove under Paragraph 11 or 14 or if the parties agree otherwise in writing.

17. LIENS: Tenant may not do anything that will cause the title of the Property or leased premises to be encumbered in any way. If Tenant causes a lien to be filed against the Property or leased premises, Tenant will within 20 days after receipt of Landlord's demand: (1) pay the lien and have the lien released of record; or (2) take action to discharge the lien. Tenant will provide Landlord a copy of any release Tenant obtains pursuant to this paragraph.

18. LIABILITY: To the extent permitted by law, Landlord is NOT responsible to Tenant or Tenant's employees, patrons, guests, or invitees for any damages, injuries, or losses to person or property caused by:

- A. an act, omission, or neglect of: Tenant; Tenant's agent; Tenant's guest; Tenant's employees; Tenant's patrons; Tenant's invitees; or any other tenant on the Property;
- B. fire, flood, water leaks, ice, snow, hail, winds, explosion, smoke, riot, strike, interruption of utilities, theft, burglary, robbery, assault, vandalism, other persons, environmental contaminants, or other occurrences or casualty losses.

19. INDEMNITY: Each party will indemnify, defend, and hold the other party harmless from any property damage, personal injury, suits, actions, liabilities, damages, cost of repairs or service to the leased premises or Property, or any other loss caused, negligently or otherwise, by that party or that party's employees, patrons, guests, or invitees.

20. DEFAULT:

- A. If Landlord fails to comply with this lease within 30 days after Tenant notifies Landlord of Landlord's failure to comply, Landlord will be in default and Tenant may seek any remedy provided by law. If, however, Landlord's non-compliance reasonably requires more than 30 days to cure, Landlord will not be in default if the cure is commenced within the 30-day period and is diligently pursued.
- B. If Landlord does not actually receive at the place designated for payment any rent due under this lease within 5 days after it is due, Tenant will be in default. If Tenant fails to comply with this lease for any other reason within 10 days after Landlord notifies Tenant of its failure to comply, Tenant will be in default.
- C. If Tenant is in default, Landlord may, with at least 3 days written notice to Tenant: (i) terminate this lease, or (ii) terminate Tenant's right to occupy the leased premises without terminating this lease and may accelerate all rents which are payable during the remainder of this lease or any renewal period. Landlord will attempt to mitigate any damage or loss caused by Tenant's breach by using commercially reasonable means. If Tenant is in default, Tenant will be liable for:
 - (1) any lost rent;
 - (2) Landlord's cost of reletting the leased premises, including brokerage fees, advertising fees, and other fees necessary to relet the leased premises;
 - (3) repairs to the leased premises for use beyond normal wear and tear;
 - (4) all Landlord's costs associated with eviction of Tenant, such as attorney's fees, court costs, and prejudgment interest;
 - (5) all Landlord's costs associated with collection of rent such as collection fees, late charges, and returned check charges;
 - (6) cost of removing any of Tenant's equipment or fixtures left on the leased premises or Property;
 - (7) cost to remove any trash, debris, personal property, hazardous materials, or environmental contaminants left by Tenant or Tenant's employees, patrons, guests, or invitees in the leased premises or Property;
 - (8) cost to replace any unreturned keys or access devices to the leased premises, parking areas, or Property; and
 - (9) any other recovery to which Landlord may be entitled under this lease or under law.

21. ABANDONMENT, INTERRUPTION OF UTILITIES, REMOVAL OF PROPERTY, AND LOCKOUT: Chapter 93 of the Texas Property Code governs the rights and obligations of the parties with regard to: (a) abandonment of the leased premises; (b) interruption of utilities; (c) removal of Tenant's property; and (d) "lock-out" of Tenant.

22. HOLDOVER: If Tenant fails to vacate the leased premises at the time this lease ends, Tenant will become a tenant-at-will and must vacate the leased premises immediately upon receipt of demand from Landlord. No holding over by Tenant, with or without the consent of Landlord, will extend this lease. Tenant will

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indemnify Landlord and any prospective tenants for any and all damages caused by the holdover. Rent for any holdover period will be 150% of the base monthly rent plus any additional rent calculated on a daily basis and will be immediately due and payable daily without notice or demand.

23. LANDLORD'S LIEN AND SECURITY INTEREST: To secure Tenant's performance under this lease, Tenant grants to Landlord a lien and security interest against all of Tenant's nonexempt personal property that is in the leased premises or on the Property. This lease is a security agreement for the purposes of the Uniform Commercial Code. Landlord may file a financing statement to perfect Landlord's security interest under the Uniform Commercial Code.

24. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING: Landlord may assign this lease to any subsequent owner of the Property. Tenant may not assign this lease or sublet any part of the leased premises without Landlord's written consent. An assignment of this lease or subletting of the leased premises without Landlord's written consent is voidable by Landlord. If Tenant assigns this lease or sublets any part of the leased premises, Tenant will remain liable for all of Tenant's obligations under this lease regardless if the assignment or sublease is made with or without the consent of Landlord.

25. RELOCATION:

A. By providing Tenant with not less than 90 days advanced written notice, Landlord may require Tenant to relocate to another location in the Property, provided that the other location is equal in size or larger than the leased premises then occupied by Tenant and contains similar leasehold improvements. Landlord will pay Tenant's reasonable out-of-pocket moving expenses for moving to the other location. "Moving expenses" means reasonable expenses payable to professional movers, utility companies for connection and disconnection fees, wiring companies for connecting and disconnecting Tenant's office equipment required by the relocation, and printing companies for reprinting Tenant's stationary and business cards. A relocation of Tenant will not change or affect any other provision of this lease that is then in effect, including rent and reimbursement amounts, except that the description of the suite or unit number will automatically be amended.

B. Landlord may not require Tenant to relocate to another location in the Property without Tenant's prior consent.

26. SUBORDINATION:

A. This lease and Tenant's leasehold interest are and will be subject, subordinate, and inferior to:
(1) any lien, encumbrance, or ground lease now or hereafter placed on the leased premises or the Property that Landlord authorizes;
(2) all advances made under any such lien, encumbrance, or ground lease;
(3) the interest payable on any such lien or encumbrance;
(4) any and all renewals and extensions of any such lien, encumbrance, or ground lease;
(5) any restrictive covenant affecting the leased premises or the Property; and
(6) the rights of any owners' association affecting the leased premises or Property.

B. Tenant must, on demand, execute a subordination, attornment, and non-disturbance agreement that Landlord may request that Tenant execute, provided that such agreement is made on the condition that this lease and Tenant's rights under this lease are recognized by the lien-holder.

27. ESTOPPEL CERTIFICATES & FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

A. Within 10 days after receipt of a written request from Landlord, Tenant will execute and deliver to Landlord an estoppel certificate that identifies the terms and conditions of this lease.

- B. Within 30 days after receipt of a written request from Landlord, Tenant will provide to Landlord Tenant's current financial information (balance sheet and income statement). Landlord may request the financial information no more frequently than once every 12 months.

28. CASUALTY LOSS:

- A. Tenant must immediately notify Landlord of any casualty loss in the leased premises. Within 20 days after receipt of Tenant's notice of a casualty loss, Landlord will notify Tenant if the leased premises are less than or more than 50% unusable, on a per square foot basis, and if Landlord can substantially restore the leased premises within 120 days after Tenant notifies Landlord of the casualty loss.
- B. If the leased premises are less than 50% unusable and Landlord can substantially restore the leased premises within 120 days after Tenant notifies Landlord of the casualty, Landlord will restore the leased premises to substantially the same condition as before the casualty. If Landlord fails to substantially restore within the time required, Tenant may terminate this lease.
- C. If the leased premises are more than 50% unusable and Landlord can substantially restore the leased premises within 120 days after Tenant notifies Landlord of the casualty, Landlord may: (1) terminate this lease; or (2) restore the leased premises to substantially the same condition as before the casualty. If Landlord chooses to restore and does not substantially restore the leased premises within the time required, Tenant may terminate this lease.
- D. If Landlord notifies Tenant that Landlord cannot substantially restore the leased premises within 120 days after Tenant notifies Landlord of the casualty loss, Landlord may: (1) choose not to restore and terminate this lease; or (2) choose to restore, notify Tenant of the estimated time to restore, and give Tenant the option to terminate this lease by notifying Landlord within 10 days.
- E. If this lease does not terminate because of a casualty loss, rent will be reduced from the date Tenant notifies Landlord of the casualty loss to the date the leased premises are substantially restored by an amount proportionate to the extent the leased premises are unusable.

29. CONDEMNATION: If after a condemnation or purchase in lieu of condemnation the leased premises are totally unusable for the purposes stated in this lease, this lease will terminate. If after a condemnation or purchase in lieu of condemnation the leased premises or Property are partially unusable for the purposes of this lease, this lease will continue and rent will be reduced in an amount proportionate to the extent the leased premises are unusable. Any condemnation award or proceeds in lieu of condemnation are the property of Landlord and Tenant has no claim to such proceeds or award. Tenant may seek compensation from the condemning authority for its moving expenses and damages to Tenant's personal property.

30. ATTORNEY'S FEES: Any person who is a prevailing party in any legal proceeding brought under or related to the transaction described in this lease is entitled to recover prejudgment interest, reasonable attorney's fees, and all other costs of litigation from the nonprevailing party.

31. REPRESENTATIONS:

- A. Tenant's statements in this lease and any application for rental are material representations relied upon by Landlord. Each party signing this lease represents that he or she is of legal age to enter into a binding contract and is authorized to sign the lease. If Tenant makes any misrepresentation in this lease or in any application for rental, Tenant is in default.
- B. Landlord is not aware of any material defect on the Property that would affect the health and safety of an ordinary person or any environmental hazard on or affecting the Property that would affect the

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health or safety of an ordinary person, except: Landlord is not aware of any material defect on the Property.

C. Each party and each signatory to this lease represents that: (1) it is not a person named as a Specially Designated National and Blocked Person as defined in Presidential Executive Order 13224; (2) it is not acting, directly or indirectly, for or on behalf of a Specially Designated and Blocked Person; and (3) is not arranging or facilitating this lease or any transaction related to this lease for a Specially Designated and Blocked Person. Any party or any signatory to this lease who is a Specially Designated and Blocked person will indemnify and hold harmless any other person who relies on this representation and who suffers any claim, damage, loss, liability or expense as a result of this representation.

Page 2 Part 3:

Term: In addition, Landlord hereby grants to Tenant the option to extend the Lease for 2 (two) extensions of three (3) months each, at the same rental rate as the original lease. The Tenant may exercise each extension by providing written notice to the Landlord, prior to the expiration of the initial or first extension, as the case may be.

Page 5 Part 7:
