Upon condition that the Contractor fully and faithfully performs the Services, Buyer shall pay an annual Contractor fee in the amount of \$61,548.00. This fee will be prorated based upon the delivery of sales subject and execution of 1,840 hours per year at \$33.45 per hour.

Replace with:

For McAlester, OK: Upon condition that the Contractor fully and faithfully performs the Services, Buyer shall pay an annual Contractor fee for an Intelligence Analyst in the amount of \$61,548.00. This fee will be prorated based upon the delivery of sales subject and execution of 1,840 hours per year at \$33.45 per hour.

For Tulsa, OK: Upon condition that the Contractor fully and faithfully performs the Services, Buyer shall pay an annual Contractor fee for an Intelligence Analyst II in the amount of \$95,477.60. This fee will be prorated based upon the delivery of sales subject and execution of 1,840 hours per year at \$51.89 per hour.

The total to be paid to MVM for provision of these services is \$157,025.60.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Texoma HIDTA Regional Intelligence Support Center (RISC) Federal Equitable Sharing

The RISC recognizes an ancillary benefit of asset forfeiture is the potential to share federal forfeiture proceeds with cooperating state and local law enforcement agencies through equitable sharing. The Equitable Sharing Program (Program) enhances cooperation between federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement by providing valuable additional resources to each RISC member agency. Equitable sharing funds are designed to supplement and enhance, not supplant, appropriated agency resources.

The RISC understands that Federal law authorizes the Attorney General and the Secretary of the Treasury to share federally forfeited property with participating state and local law enforcement agencies. The RISC understands that the exercise of this authority is discretionary and limited by statute and sharing is not required in any case. In addition, the RISC understands that sharing is only available from remaining net proceeds after recovery of government expenses and payment of victim compensation. The sharing amount for each asset will bear a reasonable relationship to the degree of direct participation of each member agency and will consider the sharing recommendations outlined in this section based on qualitative factors such as unique contributions and financial obligations of the RISC.

The RISC understands that in order for its member law enforcement agencies to receive shared funds, the member agency must be compliant with Program guidelines and reporting requirements. Each member agency's Agency Head and Governing Body Head must annually sign the member agency's Equitable Sharing Agreement and Certification (ESAC) report. By signing and submitting the ESAC report, each member agency and its jurisdiction agree to abide by all policies set forth in the current *Guide to Equitable Sharing for State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies* and all subsequent updates.

Sharing Request Submissions: Sharing requests may be submitted at any time following the seizure, but no later than 45 days after forfeiture.

Financial Management Requirements: Equitable sharing funds are awarded to each member agency to be spent at the discretion of the recipient agency. All federally shared funds received by each member agency will be maintained in separate revenue accounts/accounting codes by each member agency's jurisdiction. These funds will be treated in the same manner as appropriated funds, including procedures for all

procurement and approval processes and inclusion in all single audit requirements by the jurisdiction.

Funds may be expended in support of RISC operations, such as paying leases and renting undercover vehicles and cell phones. The RISC member agencies will not expend funds at the direction of or for the sole use of federal agencies.

Sharing Percentages:

Agency A: Navarro County SO 49% Agency C: Texas National Guard 17 %

Agency B: Irving PD 17 % Agency D: Tarrant County SO 17 %

The sharing percentages listed represent an equitable share in accordance with the statute and are based on each RISC member agency's contribution to the RISC. Contribution includes manpower, tangible contributions such as equipment and facilities, and financial contributions for revolving expenses. If one RISC member agency provides a greater financial responsibility to the RISC, such agency should receive a higher share reflective of the financial contribution.

The RISC may deviate from the above percentages on a case-by-case basis as needed upon concurrence of all RISC member agencies. Deviations from the agreed upon percentages generally would only occur in rare and unique situations involving cases where a larger than usual sharing may occur.

Change in Participation: This portion of the Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding will be updated each time a change in RISC member or manpower contribution occurs and/or if a change in financial/administrative responsibilities occurs.

Dissolution: Should the RISC disband or when a member agency withdraws from the RISC, all funds currently in that member agency's possession remain with that member agency.

Examples of Agency heads include police chief, sheriff, director, commissioner, superintendent, administrator, county attorney, district attorney, prosecuting attorney, state attorney, commonwealth attorney, and attorney general. The governing body head is the head of the agency that appropriates funding to the Agency. Examples of governing body heads include city manager, mayor, city council chairperson, county executive, county council chairperson, administrator, commissioner, and governor. The governing body head cannot be an official or employee of the Agency and must be from a separate entity.
- 3. Uses. Shared assets must be used for law enforcement purposes in accordance with the *Guide* and all subsequent updates, this Equitable Sharing Agreement, and the applicable sections of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- 4. Transfers. Before the Agency transfers funds to other state or local law enforcement agencies, it must obtain written approval from the Department of Justice or Department of the Treasury. Transfers of tangible property are not permitted. Agencies that transfer or receive equitable sharing funds must perform sub-recipient monitoring in accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations.
- **5. Internal Controls.** The Agency agrees to account separately for federal equitable sharing funds received from the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury, funds from state and local forfeitures, joint law enforcement operations funds, and any other sources must not be commingled with federal equitable sharing funds.

We hope you are enjoying the updated design and editing features of your county website hosted by the Texas Association of Counties County Information Resource Agency (TAC CIRA). This recent upgrade allows your website to display properly on mobile devices (responsive design) and meet ADA accessibility standards, in addition to an updated layout and style.

	.1 "Member" includes the Member and all officials and employees who use

- 1.1.3 "TAC" means the Texas Association of Counties.
- 1.1.4 "User" includes any person authorized by Member to use CIRA email or other Services.

1.2 Scope and conflict.

These General Terms and Conditions apply to the entire Agreement. If there is a conflict between this section and the specific terms and conditions for a particular Service, the individual terms and conditions govern. If the relationship between the terms is unclear the General Terms and Conditions will govern.

1.3 Authorized use.

Member may use CIRA-provided Services for a public purpose only and not for any private pecuniary gain. Member agrees not to use a CIRA Service to conduct a business or activity or solicit the performance of an activity that is prohibited by law. Member agrees to use the Services only for lawful purposes and in accordance with this Agreement. CIRA may amend its policies and guidelines at any time without notice to the Member.

1.4 Abuse of Services and CIRA's rights.

- 1.4.1 Prohibited activity. Activity that interrupts the normal use of the CIRA server or system for other CIRA Members is considered to be abuse of system resources and is prohibited. Examples of service abuse include spawning dozens of processes, or consuming excessive amounts of memory or CPU for long periods of time. Depending on the severity of the conduct or consequences, CIRA may issue a User that abuses the system an email warning or suspend the Member's or a User's account without notice. If CIRA determines that the abuse or misuse is unintentional, it may rescind a User's suspension.
- 1.4.2 Reporting required. Member must report to CIRA any information it has or obtains related to a current or past violation of CIRA policies or guidelines resulting in abuse of Services.
- 1.4.3 Investigation and action authorized. CIRA may investigate any reported violation of this Agreement or CIRA policies or guidelines and take any action that it deems appropriate and reasonable under the circumstance to protect CIRA servers and systems, Members or third parties. CIRA will not access or review the contents of any email or similar stored electronic communications except as required or permitted by applicable law or legal process.

- 1.4.4 Public information. Member also understands that information stored on CIRA servers and systems incident to use of CIRA Services may be subject to disclosure under the Public Information Act, Government Code Chapter 552.
- 1.4.5 Content restriction or removal. CIRA may, but is not obligated to, restrict or remove from its servers any content that violates this Agreement or related policies or guidelines, or is otherwise objectionable or potentially infringing on any third party's rights or that potentially violates any laws. If CIRA becomes aware that a Member or User has violated this Agreement or related policies or guidelines, third party rights or laws, CIRA may immediately take action, including:
- (a) issuing a warning;
- (b) suspending or terminating a Service;
- restricting or prohibiting use of content hosted on CIRA's servers or systems; and
- (d) disabling or removing any hypertext link to third-party websites, any information or content distributed or made available for distribution through a Service, or other content not supplied by CIRA that, in CIRA's sole discretion, may violate a law or infringe on a third-party right or that otherwise exposes or potentially exposes CIRA to civil or criminal liability.
- 1.4.6 Editorial control. CIRA's rights under this Agreement do not obligate CIRA to monitor or exert editorial control over information or content made available by a Member for distribution through a Service.

1.5 Security.

- 1.5.1 Password protection. SECURITYIS THE RESPONSIBILITYOF EVERYONE. Member and each authorized User agree to keep individual passwords secure and not disclose individual passwords to any other person for any reason with the exception of a CIRA representative if User requests technical support. If a User believes that the security of a password has been compromised, it is the User's responsibility to change the password to prevent unauthorized access to an account. If a User loses or cannot remember a password, the User must contact CIRA immediately to request that the password be reset.
- 1.5.2 Security breach. Member and its Users are solely responsible for any security breaches affecting Member accounts. If a Member's account is

responsible for or involved in an attack on or unauthorized access into another server or system, CIRA may terminate the account and Services without notice.

1.5.3 Policy compliance. If a Member's failure to comply with the CIRA service agreement causes damage to a CIRA or third-party account, another Member, or CIRA systems, CIRA may hold the Member responsible for the costs incurred by CIRA to correct the security breaches and restore the servers or systems.

ALL SERVICES PERFORMED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT ARE PERFORMED "AS IS" AND WITHOUT WARRANTY AGAINST FAILURE OF PERFORMANCE INCLUDING ANY FAILURE BECAUSE OF COMPUTER HARDWARE OR COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED IN THIS AGREEMENT, CIRA

DOES NOT MAKE AND DISCLAIMS, AND MEMBER WAIVES ALL RELIANCE ON, ANY REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES, ARISING BY LAW OR OTHERWISE, REGARDING THE SERVICES, INCLUDING IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, NON-INFRINGEMENT, OR ARISING FROM COURSE OF DEALING, COURSE OF PERFORMANCE OR USAGE IN TRADE.

1.7.2 No liability. CIRA is not liable for any temporary delay, outages or interruptions of a Service, nor is CIRA liable for any damages resulting from a delay, outage or interruption. CIRA is not liable for unauthorized access to, or alteration, theft, or destruction of the website or a Member's data files, programs or information through accident, fraudulent or unauthorized means or devises, if resulting from the action of Members officials, employees or agents, or a third party authorized by Member. CIRA is liable for unauthorized access to, or alteration, theft, or destruction of the website or a Member's data files, programs or information through accident, fraudulent or unauthorized means or devises, if resulting from the action of CIRA's employees or agents, or a third party authorized by CIRA. CIRA's liability for any reason or any cause of action, including breach of contract, breach of warranty, negligence, strict liability, misrepresentations, and other torts is limited to three times the amount of annual fees actually paid to CIRA by Member under this Agreement.

1.8 Indemnification and defense.

1.10 Term and Termination.

- 1.10.1 Term. The term of this Agreement is from the effective date to December 31 of the same year. The Agreement will automatically renew annually for one-year terms beginning January 1 and ending December 31, unless terminated as provided in this section.
- 1.10.2 Agreement termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time following 30-days written notice to the other party.
- 1.10.3 Service termination. Either party may terminate a Service at any time following 30-days written notice to the other party. If Member terminates a Service without cause, Member will not be entitled to a refund of fees paid under this Agreement. If CIRA fails to perform a Service under this Agreement and fails to cure the defect within 30 days of receiving written notice of the failure by the Member, Member may terminate for cause. If Member terminates this agreement for cause as provided in this section, Member will be entitled to

return of any fees paid for Services that have not been rendered at the time of termination.

1.11 Applicable Law.

The laws of the State of Texas shall govern the interpretation, validity, performance and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue is in Travis County, Texas.

1.12 Severability.

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable under present or future laws, the legality, validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement will not be affected.

1.13 Amendment.

Except as provide in Section 1.3, Authorized Use, this Agreement may not be amended or modified except in writing, as authorized by the governing bodies of CIRA and the Member.

1.14 Third Party Rights.

This Agreement does not and is not intended to confer any rights or remedies upon any person other than the parties.

1.15 Assignment.

This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

1.16 Payment terms.

CIRA will invoice Member for services under this Agreement as follows: (1) monthly for email; and (2) annually for websites. Member will pay within 30 days of receipt of invoice, unless other payment arrangements are approved in writing by CIRA. If Member fails to make a payment when due, CIRA may: (1) suspend services; and (2) charge a service charge of one percent per month on the total amount due or the maximum legal rate allowed by law, whichever is less. CIRA may recover legal costs, including attorney fees, if collection activities are required to collect outstanding fees under this Agreement.



2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR EMAIL SERVICES.

2.1 Email storage.

A Member may not allow its employees to store personal emails on the email server, and should require employees to promptly delete personal email after it is sent or received. Member-related email should not be stored on the email server for more than 90 days.

2.2 Email deletion.

Member understands and agrees that CIRA may purge any *deleted* email that has been on the email server for more than 90 days after it has provided Member with 60 day notice that it intends to purge email, including the date of the purge. CIRA may purge any other email may be purged after one year, following 60 day notice to the Member that it intends to purge email.

2.3 Email backup.

CIRA Services under this agreement do not include making backup copies of email, and CIRA is not responsible for retrieving deleted or purged emails.

2.4 Records retention.

CIRA is not responsible for ensuring that the Member's officials and employees comply with applicable records retention laws and policies. Member understands and agrees that it is the Member's obligation to ensure that emails subject to records retention requirements are retained in a format other than on the email server for an appropriate period of time.

2.5 Email Administrator.

Member shall designate a person who will manage the Member's email accounts and perform the duties set forth below. CIRA will provide training to an Email Administrator as necessary to facilitate Member use of CIRA Services and to promote compliance with CIRA policies and guidelines. The frequency and content of any training provided under this section will be at CIRA's discretion.

Responsibilities of Email Administrator.

Responsibilities of the Email Administrator include:

- 2.6.1 Developing and implementing a procedure for determining which employees who will be allowed to use the available email accounts.
- 2.6.2 Maintaining a record of the name of each email User and a copy of each User's Individual User Agreement.

- 2.6.3 Resetting passwords and emphasizing the importance of proper security measures in the use of the password.
- 2.6.4 Assisting email account Users with complying with applicable records retention requirements and schedules and any Member policies regarding records management.
- 2.6.5 Adding, modifying and deleting email accounts in compliance with applicable records retention schedules and records management plans.
- 2.6.6 Notifying an individual User before deleting an email account to provide an opportunity for preservation of email off of the email server.
- 2.6.7 Configuring email programs on a Member's computers as necessary to access the email server.

2.7 E-mail Terms and Conditions; Individual User's Obligations.

As a condition of a Member receiving email Service, each User authorized by the Member must agree to abide by the CIRA email terms and conditions by executing the form attached as Exhibit B and delivering it to the Member's Email Administrator. A User periodically may be required, prior to log in, to confirm the User's agreement to abide by CIRA's email terms and conditions. Member understands that a User's failure to confirm his or her agreement to abide by CIRA's email terms and conditions may result in the User's inability to access an email account. CIRA may change the terms and conditions for email Service and use as necessary to protect CIRA, its network, and its Members and their resources. To the extent practical, CIRA will promptly notify Member of any changes made to CIRA's email terms and conditions. CIRA will post the current version of the applicable terms and conditions on the CIRA website at www.cira.state.tx.us.

2.8 Email security.

- 2.8.1 Maintaining the security and integrity of the Member's e-mail system is VERY IMPORTANT and is EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY.
- 2.8.2 Member agrees not to share an individual e-mail account or password with anyone. Alias, office, or department accounts may be shared but Users are strongly encouraged to limit access or use of the account to only those officials or employees who need access to perform their job duties.

- 2.8.3 Member agrees not to share email passwords with anyone. Technical exception will apply if the User requests assistance from a CIRA representative.
- 2.8.4 Each User's email password will be required to meet certain requirements set by CIRA for security purposes, and Member agrees to comply with those standards when establishing or changing an email password.
- 2.8.5 Member agrees to prohibit Users from leaving an email password in plain view on or near a computer.

2.9 Email Support.

2.9.1 CIRA staff will provide basic email support and assistance to Member. CIRA staff is not liable for implementation or support for third-party mail client programs such as Outlook, Thunderbird, MacMail, etc. CIRA staff will provide instruction and settings for Email account setup, troubleshoot send and receive errors and password assistance. Member is responsible for support beyond these parameters. CIRA does not provide support for software applications, computer hardware, or operating systems for a User's computer.

3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR WEBSITE SERVICES.

3.1 Internet domain name.

Member may authorize CIRA to obtain or host the Member's Internet domain name, by completing the form attached as Exhibit C. For example, the standard format for a county's Internet domain name is www.co. [county name].tx.us.

3.2 Internet service.

CIRA does not provide a Member with Internet access as a part of its website Service. Member must make arrangements with an Internet provider for Internet access.

3.3 Server storage.

CIRA will provide a Member with storage space on CIRA's server to house the data and files that constitute the Member's website. If a Member permits a specific department to operate a separate website, CIRA will also host that website at an additional charge for each website as provided in Exhibit A.

3.4 CIRA and TAC logos and links.

Member agrees to allow CIRA to place CIRA and Texas Association of Counties (TAC) logos on the Member's website home page and to include a link to both the TAC and CIRA websites on the Member's home page.

3.5 Website accessibility and Service interruption.

Except as provided below, CIRA will ensure that Member's website is accessible to third parties via the World Wide Web portion of the Internet 24 hours a day, seven days a week. At its sole discretion, CIRA may conduct maintenance and repair to its servers and systems which may result in a temporary loss of website accessibility or Service. Additionally, equipment failure may cause a temporary loss of website accessibility or Service. Member agrees that CIRA is not liable for any loss or interruption of website accessibility or Service regardless of the cause of interruption.

3.6 Content posting.

- 3.6.1 CIRA is not responsible for providing or posting website content unless that Service is specifically selected on Exhibit A. If Member determines website content and posts directly to its website, it agrees to use the content management software authorized or provided by CIRA.
- 3.6.2 If Member elects for CIRA to manage website content for Member's website, then the scope for website content management will follow these guidelines:
- (a) CIRA will post all state mandated documents submitted by Member.
- (b) CIRA will update staff information and all basic text updates requested by Member
- (c) CIRA will post all photos, graphics and documents that are appropriate and submitted by Member.
- (d) Any edit request submitted by Member that is deemed a customization of the website will be subject to a customization fee and is not included in the annual content management fee. A CIRA representative will notify Member of potential charge and discuss the edit request in depth with Member before implementation.
- 3.6.3 Member is responsible for compliance with all statutory posting requirements for its website, regardless of whether CIRA is providing website maintenance service.

- 3.6.4 CIRA performs content management updates during the following business hours: Monday through Friday 8am to 5pm. Website posting requests received after 5pm will be processed on the following business day. In order to comply with Government Code §551.056, member is solely responsible for timely submission of materials to CIRA for purposes of compliance with statutory imposed deadlines; e.g. 72 hour notice for commissioners court agendas. Emergency meeting notifications will be posted promptly after actual receipt by a CIRA staff member.
- 3.6.5 Member is responsible for submitting time-sensitive posting requests to CIRA in a timely manner. CIRA is not responsible for failure to comply with legal mandate if Member submits a posting request outside the window of time required by the State of Texas.
- 3.6.6 Customization of county websites. If a member requests a website update that will alter the appearance of the website beyond the standard template, it will be considered a customization of the website, and the Member will be charged accordingly.

3.7 Third-party content.

Member understands and agrees that Member and its individual Users are responsible for:

- (a) acquiring any authorization necessary for hypertext links to third-party web sites;
- (b) ensuring the accuracy of materials posted on the website, including thirdparty material; and
- (c) ensuring that the posted content does not infringe or violate any right, including an intellectual property right, of any third party.

3.8 Prohibited content.

Member agrees not to place or allow a User to place on the website any content or materials that:

- (a) could be seen as obscene, threatening, or malicious;
- (b) violates an applicable law or regulation;
- infringes on a proprietary, contract, or other third-party right, including an intellectual property right; or
- (d) is designed to cause damage or harm to a computer or computer system accessing the website, including interruption of service.

4. ADDITIONAL SERVICES.

4.1 CIRA may offer Member services in addition email and website services as agreed to in writing by both parties in an addendum to this Agreement. Payment terms for any additional services will be included in the negotiated terms.

Before any funds are payable under this PO, Seller shall provide the County with an IRS Form W-9 Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification that is completed in compliance with the IRS regulations. For determining applicability of payment discounts, time begins upon the later of a) satisfactory delivery and acceptance of items and services or b) submission of an invoice that includes at least the PO number, description of items, quantity, unit price, total per item and total invoice amount. As authorized by Texas Tax Code section 151.309, Seller shall not include any state or local taxes in the price sated in this PO or any invoice. County pays Seller after satisfactory delivery and acceptance of all items and services and after Seller submits an invoice as described in b) above. County does not make partial payments unless payment terms are specifically stated in this PO. Texas Government Code Chapter 2251 (the "Prompt Payment Act") governs interest in overdue payments. If Seller is delinquent in paying property taxes to the Navarro County Tax Assessor-Collector at the time of invoicing, Seller assigns any payments due under this PO to the Navarro County Tax Assessor-Collector in payment for said delinquent taxes.
- 7.0 INFORMATION AND REPORTS. Seller shall provide all information and reports required by the regulations or directives issued pursuant to them. Seller shall permit access to its books, records,

accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as County may determine to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with these regulations, orders, and instructions. Where any information required of Seller is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, Seller shall so certify to County, as appropriate, and shall state what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

8.0 NONDISCRIMINATION

- 8.1 Compliance with Regulations. Seller shall comply with the requirements relative to nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted programs, including Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act (42 USC Section 2000d, et. Seq.) and 49 CFR Part 21, both as explained in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Circular 4702.1A, as they may be amended (the "Regulations") which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this PO.
- 8.2 Nondiscrimination. Regarding the work performed by Seller under this PO, Seller shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. Seller shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices.
- 8.3 Sanctions for Noncompliance. If Seller does not comply with the nondiscrimination provisions of this PO, County shall impose the sanctions that it determines are appropriate, including, but not limited to, withholding of payments to Seller under the PO until Seller complies, or cancellation, termination or suspension of the PO, in whole or in part.
- 8.4 <u>Incorporation of Provisions</u>. Seller shall include the provisions of sections 7.0 ("INFORMATION and REPORTS") in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant to them.
- 9.0 CERTIFICATION OF ELIGIBLITY. Seller certifies that neither it nor its principals are debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction y any federal department or agency. Seller shall include this certification requirement in all subcontracts related to this PO that exceed \$25,000.00
- 10.0 OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT. Seller shall not provide any employee or official of County any share of this PO, or any benefit that may arise from it. Seller shall not provide any gratuity in any form, including entertainment and gifts, to any County employee, official, buyer, or agent to secure this PO or an amendment to it, or any determination about performance under it. County, at its sole discretion may rescind or terminate this PO if Seller violates this provision.
- 11.0 COVERNANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES. Seller warrants that no one, except its bona fide employees and its commercial selling agencies, has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this PO for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee. For breach of this warranty, County may, in its sole discretion, terminate this PO without liability or deduct the full amount of commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee from the PO price, or otherwise recover the full amount.
- 12.0 CHANGE OF NAME AGREEMENTS. If Seller requires a change of name agreement for any reason, Seller shall notify the Auditor's Office immediately. County does not recognize any change in the Seller's obligations until the Commissioners Court or Auditor's Office approves the change. Approval modifies this PO to reflect this change.
- 13.0 SUCCESSORS and ASSIGNS. This PO is binding upon and inures to the benefit of County and Seller and their respective successors, executors, administrators, and assigns. Neither County nor Seller may assign, sublet, or transfer its interest in or obligations under this PO without written consent of the other. However, Auditor's Office will prepare a modification to allow Seller to assign this PO to a company controlling, controlled by, or under common control with Seller or to an entity acquiring substantially all of the assets to Seller, provided Seller guarantee the performance of and causes the assignee to assume in writing all obligations of Seller under this PO.
- 14.0 FORCE MAJEURE. If the performance is interrupted or delayed by any occurrence not within the control of the County or Seller, whether caused by an act of God, war, riot, civil commotion, sovereign conduct, natural disaster, or the conduct of any other person, then the interrupted or delayed party is

- excused from performance for the time reasonable necessary to remedy the effects of the cause of the interruption or delay.
- NON-WAVIER of DEFAULT. All rights of County under this PO are specifically reserved and a payment, act, or omission shall not impair or prejudice any remedy or title to County under it. No right or remedy in this PO precludes the exercise of any other right or remedy under it or under any law, except as expressly provided in this PO, and any action taken in the exercise of any right or remedy shall not be deemed a waiver of any other rights or remedies.
- 16.0 MEDIATION. When mediation is acceptable to both County and Seller, they will use a mutually acceptable mediator, or a mediator appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction. Mediation is conducted in compliance with Chapter 154 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Unless both County and Seller are satisfied with the mediated resolution, that resolution is not a final and binding resolution of the dispute. All communication within the scope of mediation must remain confidential in compliance with section 154.073 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, unless both County and Seller waive the confidentially in writing.
- 17.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT and MODIFICATION. This PO contains the entire agreement between the County and Seller relating to the rights granted and the obligations assumed under it. Any prior agreements or representations not expressly stated in this PO are of no force. Only a subsequent modification in writing signed by the Auditor's Office may change the terms and conditions of this PO. Seller acknowledges Commissioners Court has expressly granted that person specific authority to do so.
- 18.0 ORDER of PRECEDENCE. If any provisions of this PO or references documents are in consistent or conflicting, the following descending order of precedence shall apply: (i) Specifications, (ii) Drawings, (iii) Special Terms and Conditions, (iv) General Terms and Conditions, and (v) Item Description.

19.0 INTERPRETATION of PURCHASE ORDER

- 19.1 General. In this PO, words are given their ordinary meaning unless the word is connected with and used with reference to a particular trade or subject matter or is used as a word of art, and then the word has the meaning given by experts in the particular trade, subject matter, or art. Words in the present or past tense include the future tense. The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the singular unless expressly provided otherwise. The masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter genders.
- Definitions. In this PO, the following have the meanings indicated: (i) "County" = Navarro County, State of Texas, (ii) "Commissioners Court" = Navarro County Commissioners Court, (iii) "IRS" = Internal Revenue Service, (iv) "Item" = any service, equipment, good, or other tangible or intangible property described in "this PO, (v) "Auditor's Office" = Navarro County Auditor's Office responsible for issuing purchase orders for the county, (vi) "Seller" = the entity subject to this Purchase Order and contract from County, (vii) "Subcontractor" = any entity that Seller relies on for any portion of its performance under this Purchase Order
- 19-3 <u>Severability.</u> If any provision in this PO is for any reason held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, that invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision in this PO, and this PO will be interpreted as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had not been included.
- 19.4 Governing Law and Venue. This PO is governed by and shall be interpreted under the laws of the United States of America and the State of Texas, and all obligations under this PO are performable in Navarro County, Texas. Venue for any dispute arising out of this PO lies in the appropriate court in Navarro County, Texas.
- 20.0 INSPECTION of BIDS. By submitting a bid, Seller acknowledges and approves that preliminary bid tabulations, including unit pricing, will be made available for inspection and disclosed upon request pursuant to Sec. 262.026 (b) of Texas Local Government Code.
- 21.0 TEX. COV'T CODE CH. 2270 VERIFICATION. Seller's acceptance of this Purchase Order serves as written verification that Seller does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the PO Term.

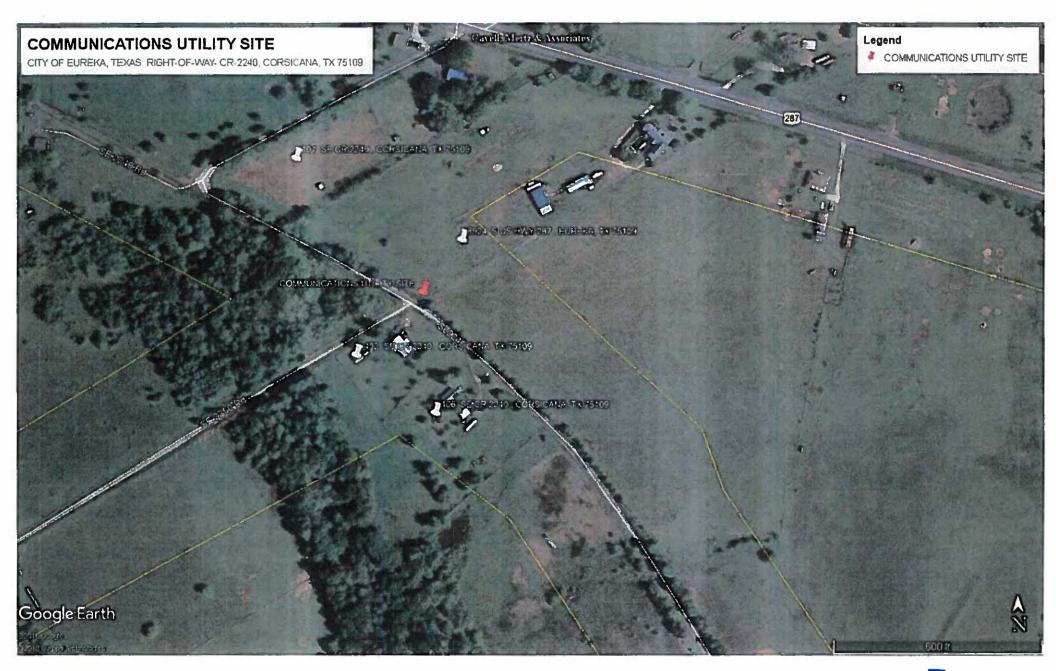






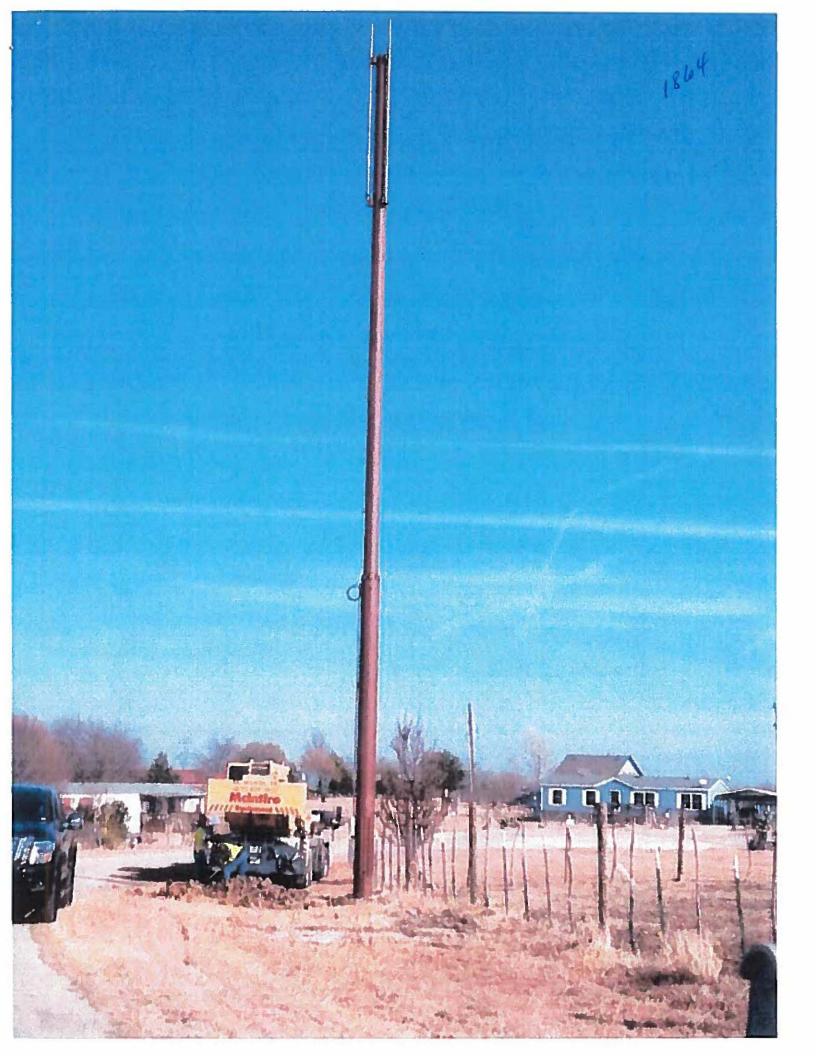












AGREEMENT FOR LICENSE ADJACENT TO OR CROSSING COUNTY ROADS

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COUNTY OF NAVARRO §
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:
MEN 495C , Owner of a (pipeline, utility line, gas or sewer
line) hereby contracts and covenants with Navarro County ("the County") as follows:
1. MEN WATER Suffoly, desires to construct and maintain a
pipeline, utility line, or gas or sewer line in Navarro County, Texas and it is necessary to cross
certain county road(s) SECR 3040 located in Precinct # 2, more
fully described on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.
The license granted herein shall extend 5 feet on either side of the pipeline as it crosses the
county road.
II. In consideration for the County granting permission through the issuance of a
permit to lay a pipeline, utility line, or gas or sewer line adjacent to or crossing said county roads
above described in Navarro County, Texas, the Owner hereby warrants, agrees and covenants
that any crossing shall be constructed as follows:
All county road crossings shall be bored unless a variance is granted by Navarro County Commissioners Court, and lines underneath such roads shall be cased or otherwise constructed to provide maximum protection against damage or leaks. Owner may not block the county road during construction and must provide for at least one lane of traffic. The points where the pipeline crosses the road shall be clearly marked and the line shall be placed at a depth of no less than 3 feet underneath the lowest part of the County's bar ditches and/or road surfaces.

(A detailed construction plan must be submitted with application)

Pipelines which run adjacent to a county road and which are within a county road casement shall be placed at a depth of no less than ______ feet underneath the lowest part of the County's har ditches and/or road surfaces.

The pipeline shall be constructed in a safe and prudent manner and shall consist of only acceptable commercial pipeline materials. The Owner shall be responsible for maintaining the pipeline and the license area. In the event the pipeline is ever abandoned or ceases be used for more than 6 consecutive months, this license shall terminate and revert to the County. In addition, if the pipeline is ever abandoned or ceases to be used for more than 6 consecutive months, the Owner shall, at the County's request, remove the pipeline from the license area and restore the property to its original condition.

SEE ATTACHMENT "A" IF THIS IS FOR A PETROLEUM PIPELINE.

- III. In consideration of the granting of this license (pipeline, utility line, gas or sewer Line) adjacent to or across the County's roads, the Owner warrants and covenants that any damages which may be caused to County or adjacent property as a result of the construction, maintenance or operation of a pipeline shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner and the Owner warrants and covenants that the area where the construction takes place shall be repaired and put back in the same condition as it originally was before such construction took place.
- IV. The County and Owner hereby covenant and agree that for each violation of this License agreement, Owner shall pay to the County liquidated damages in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per day, per violation, until such violation have been corrected

and the County's requirements complied with. Such compliance shall be determined by the County Commissioner in whose precinct the work occurs.

V. Owner, at its own expense, shall maintain a general liability insurance policy in an amount sufficient to insure against loss or damages caused by the construction, maintenance and operation of the pipeline. The general liability insurance requirement may be met by a combination of self-insurance, primary and excess insurance policies. Owner shall also, at its own expense, carry worker's compensation insurance as required by law.

VI. Owner, its successors and assigns agree to release, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County its respective commissioners, agents and employees (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties"), from any and all costs, losses, claims, judgments, settlements, and damages of every kind and character to real property, personal property or persons (including, without limitation, claims involving environmental laws and regulations, pollution, contamination of ground waters, personal injury and death), lawsuits and/or causes of action (including reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees and court costs) (collectively "Claima"), which may grow out of, arise from, or in any manner be connected with the activities of Owner's agents, invitees, guests, contractors, servants and employees, on the license area, or any adjacent property, including, without limitation, any Claims arising from loss of subsurface support of any County road and any Claims arising from the production or transportation of materials through any pipeline. For purposes of this license, environmental laws and regulations include, without limitation, the federal Oil Pollution Act (OPA), the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA), the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), the federal Clean Water Act, the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act

(TSWDA), the Texas Water Code (TWC), and the federal, state and local rules, regulations, ordinances, orders and governmental directives implementing such statutes.

As used in this license, the term "Hazardous Materials" means any substance or material defined or identified as hazardous, extra-hazardous, toxic or radioactive or subject to regulation as a solid waste or pollutant under any applicable federal, state, or local statute or regulation including, without limitation, the environmental laws and regulations referenced herein. "Remedial Work" is defined as any site investigation or monitoring, any cleanup. containment, remediation, removal, or restoration work performed in response to any federal. state or local government authority or private party action ("action"), or pursuant to any federal, state or local statute, rule, regulation, ordinance, order, governmental directive or other laws ("law"). Owner agrees, for the benefit of the County and any adjacent surface owner, (1) to remove from the license area, if, as and when required by any action or law, any Hazardous Materials placed or released thereon by Owner (including its contractors), (2) to perform Remedial Work where the need therefore arises in connection with Owner's (including its contractors) operations or activities on the license area or any adjacent property, and (3) to comply in all respects with all laws governing operations by Owner (including its contractors) and Remedial Work on or associated with the license area and any adjacent property. Remedial Work shall be performed by one or more contractors selected by Owner under the supervision of an engineer selected by Owner. All costs and expenses of Remedial Work resulting from Owner's (including its drillers' and other contactors') operations shall be paid by Owner. including, without limitation, the charges of such contractors and/or the consulting engineer and the County's reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred in connection with the monitoring or

review of Remedial Work. If Owner shall fail to timely commence or cause to be commenced, or fail to diligently prosecute to completion, such Remedial Work, the County may (but shall not be required to), after first giving Owner thirty (30) days notice of its failure and Owner's continued failure to perform, cause such Remedial Work to be performed and Owner will reimburse all reasonable costs of same on demand. The provisions of this Article shall not constitute approval or obligate The County or the surface owner to consent to the imposition of any engineering or institutional control that would restrict or limit future use of the License area for any purpose including, without limitation, any deed restriction or limitation on the use of groundwater or use of the property for residential purposes. Owner will notify the County and surface owner of any claim or other action by any governmental agency or any third party involving the actual or alleged existence of Hazardous Materials on the License area or any adjoining property and provide the County and surface owner with copies of (1) any notice of any actual or threatened release of Hazardous Materials given by Owner pursuant to any law and (2) any report of and response to any such release including all Remedial Work. Owner, its successors and assigns, in accordance with the provisions of Article 8, will release, indemnify, pay and protect, defend and save the Indemnified Parties harmless from all claims, liabilities, fees and expenses of any kind (including reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees and costs) that arise from the actual or alleged presence or release of any Hazardous Materials in connection with the operations of Owner and Owner's agents, invitees, guests, contractors, servants and employees on the License area or any adjacent property. Such indemnification shall include, without limitation, costs in connection with any Remedial Work performed by the County, surface owner, or any third party in response to any federal, state or governmental authority, laws or regulations, due and payable upon demand by the County or adjacent surface owner.

Owner's obligations herein shall survive the termination of this License.

VII. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

VIII. This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created by this Agreement are performable in Navarro County, Texas.

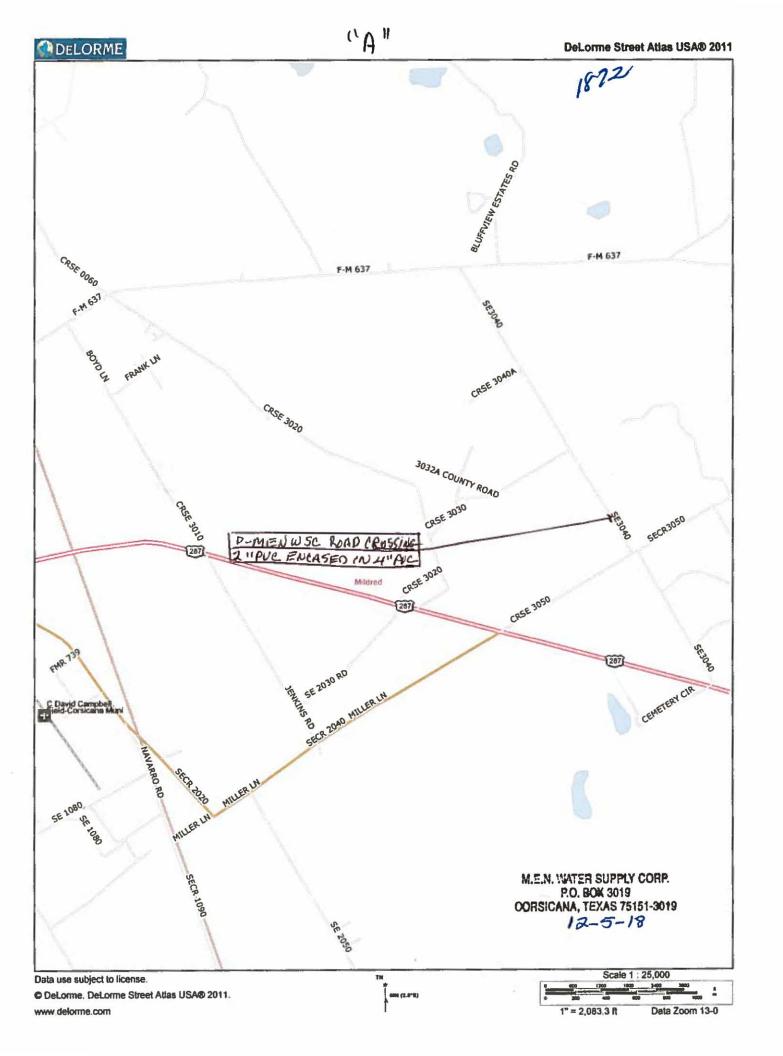

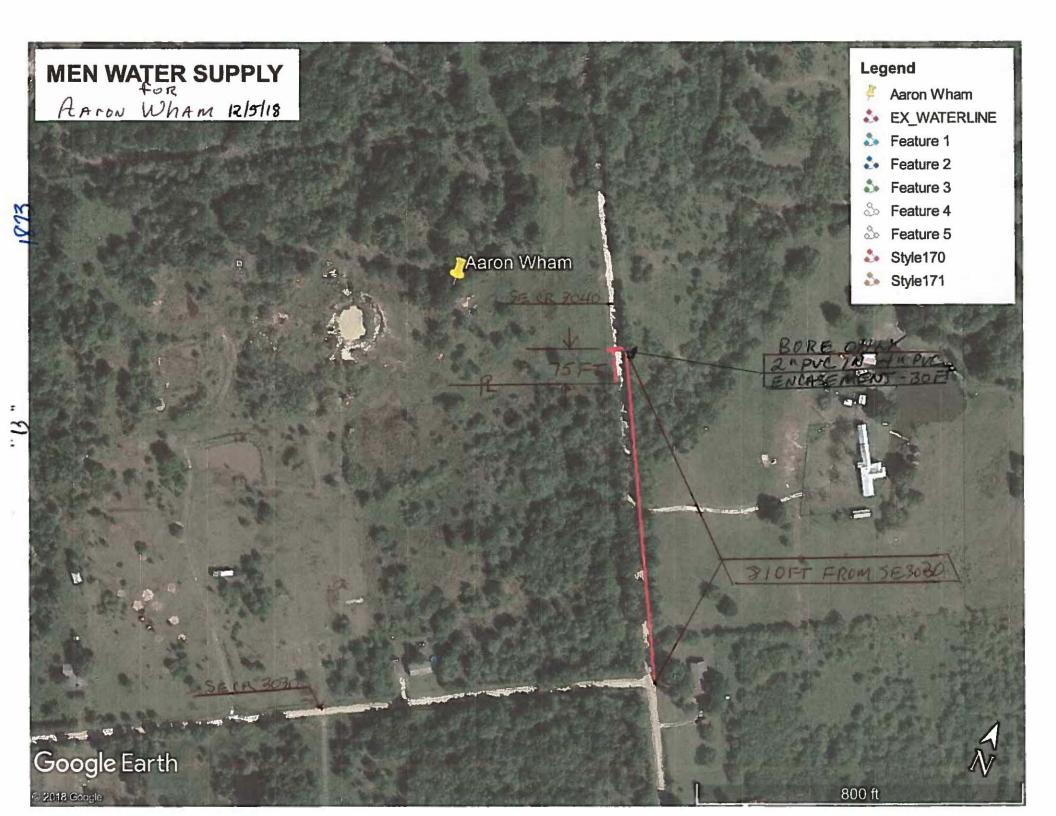

AGREEMENT FOR LICENSE ADJACENT TO OR CROSSING COUNTY ROADS

STATE OF TEXAS §
COUNTY OF NAVARRO §
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:
MEN W5C , Owner of a (pipeline, utility line, gas or sewer
line) hereby contracts and covenants with Navarro County ("the County") as follows:
1. MEN WATER Supply, desires to construct and maintain a
pipeline, utility line, or gas or sewer line in Navarro County, Texas and it is necessary to cross
certain county road(s) <u>5ECR 3085</u> located in Precinct # 2, more
fully described on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.
The license granted herein shall extend 5 feet on either side of the pipeline as it crosses the
county road.
II. In consideration for the County granting permission through the issuance of a
permit to lay a pipeline, utility line, or gas or sewer line adjacent to or crossing said county roads
above described in Navarro County, Texas, the Owner hereby warrants, agrees and covenants
that any crossing shall be constructed as follows:
All county road crossings shall be bored unless a variance is granted by Navarro County Commissioners Court, and lines underneath such roads shall be cased or otherwise constructed to provide maximum protection against damage or leaks. Owner may not block the county road during construction and must provide for at least one lane of traffic. The points where the pipeline crosses the road shall be clearly marked and the line shall be placed at a depth of no less than feet underneath the lowest part of the County's bar ditches and/or road surfaces.

WATER DISTRIBUTION LINE

The transport route (beginning and end): See ATTACHMONTS A 2 B

(A detailed construction plan must be submitted with application)

Pipelines which run adjacent to a county road and which are within a county road casement shall be placed at a depth of no less than _____ feet underneath the lowest part of the County's har ditches and/or road surfaces.

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- IV. The County and Owner hereby covenant and agree that for each violation of this License agreement, Owner shall pay to the County liquidated damages in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per day, per violation, until such violation have been corrected

and the County's requirements complied with. Such compliance shall be determined by the County Commissioner in whose precinct the work occurs.

- V. Owner, at its own expense, shall maintain a general liability insurance policy in an amount sufficient to insure against loss or damages caused by the construction, maintenance and operation of the pipeline. The general liability insurance requirement may be met by a combination of self-insurance, primary and excess insurance policies. Owner shall also, at its own expense, carry worker's compensation insurance as required by law.
- VI. Owner, its successors and assigns agree to release, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County its respective commissioners, agents and employees (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties"), from any and all costs, losses, claims, judgments, settlements, and damages of every kind and character to real property, personal property or persons (including, without limitation, claims involving environmental laws and regulations, pollution, contamination of ground waters, personal injury and death), lawsuits and/or causes of action (including reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees and court costs) (collectively "Claims"), which may grow out of, arise from, or in any manner be connected with the activities of Owner's agents, invitees, guests, contractors, servants and employees, on the license area, or any adjacent property, including, without limitation, any Claims arising from loss of subsurface support of any County road and any Claims arising from the production or transportation of materials through any pipeline. For purposes of this license, environmental laws and regulations include, without limitation, the federal Oil Pollution Act (OPA), the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA), the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), the federal Clean Water Act, the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act

(TSWDA), the Texas Water Code (TWC), and the federal, state and local rules, regulations, ordinances, orders and governmental directives implementing such statutes.

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review of Remedial Work. If Owner shall fail to timely commence or cause to be commenced, or fail to diligently prosecute to completion, such Remedial Work, the County may (but shall not be required to), after first giving Owner thirty (30) days notice of its failure and Owner's continued failure to perform, cause such Remedial Work to be performed and Owner will reimburse all reasonable costs of same on demand. The provisions of this Article shall not constitute approval or obligate The County or the surface owner to consent to the imposition of any engineering or institutional control that would restrict or limit future use of the License area for any purpose including, without limitation, any deed restriction or limitation on the use of groundwater or use of the property for residential purposes. Owner will notify the County and surface owner of any claim or other action by any governmental agency or any third party involving the actual or alleged existence of Hazardous Materials on the License area or any adjoining property and provide the County and surface owner with copies of (1) any notice of any actual or threatened release of Hazardous Materials given by Owner pursuant to any law and (2) any report of and response to any such release including all Remedial Work. Owner, its successors and assigns, in accordance with the provisions of Article 8, will release, indemnify, pay and protect, defend and save the Indemnified Parties harmless from all claims, liabilities, fees and expenses of any kind (including reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees and costs) that arise from the actual or alleged presence or release of any Hazardous Materials in connection with the operations of Owner and Owner's agents, invitees, guests, contractors, servants and employees on the License area or any adjacent property. Such indemnification shall include, without limitation, costs in connection with any Remedial Work performed by the County, surface owner, or any third party in response to any federal, state or governmental authority, laws

or regulations, due and payable upon demand by the County or adjacent surface owner.

Owner's obligations herein shall survive the termination of this License.

VII. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and

their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

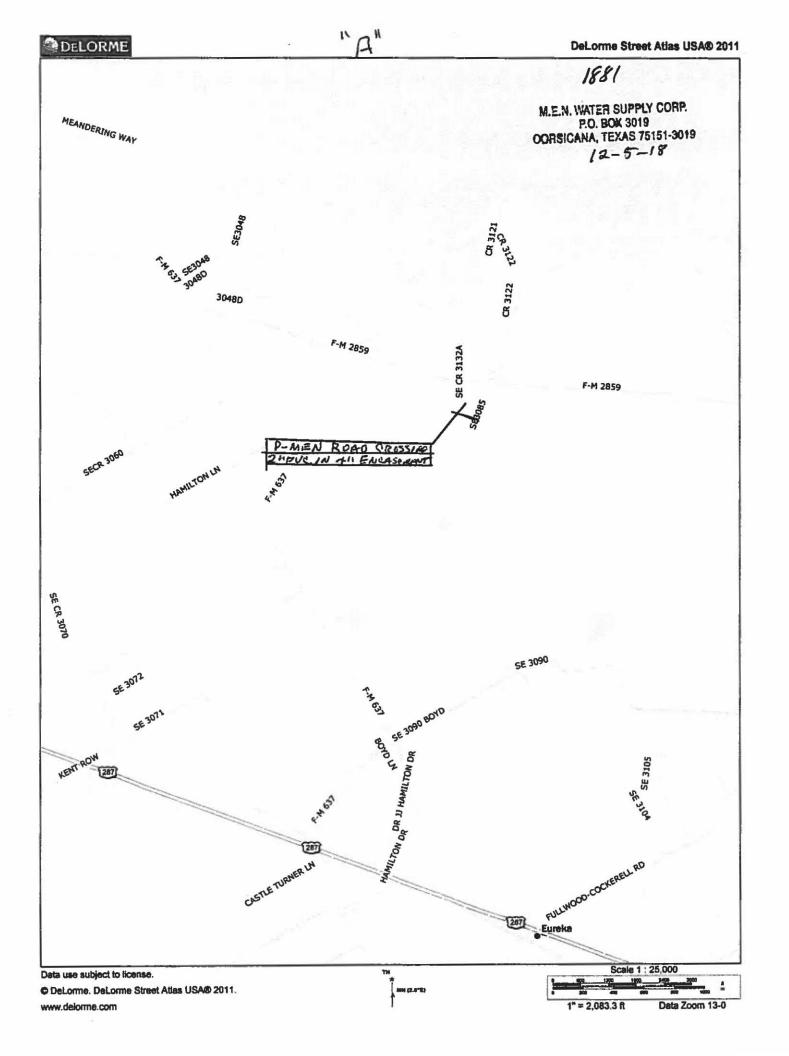

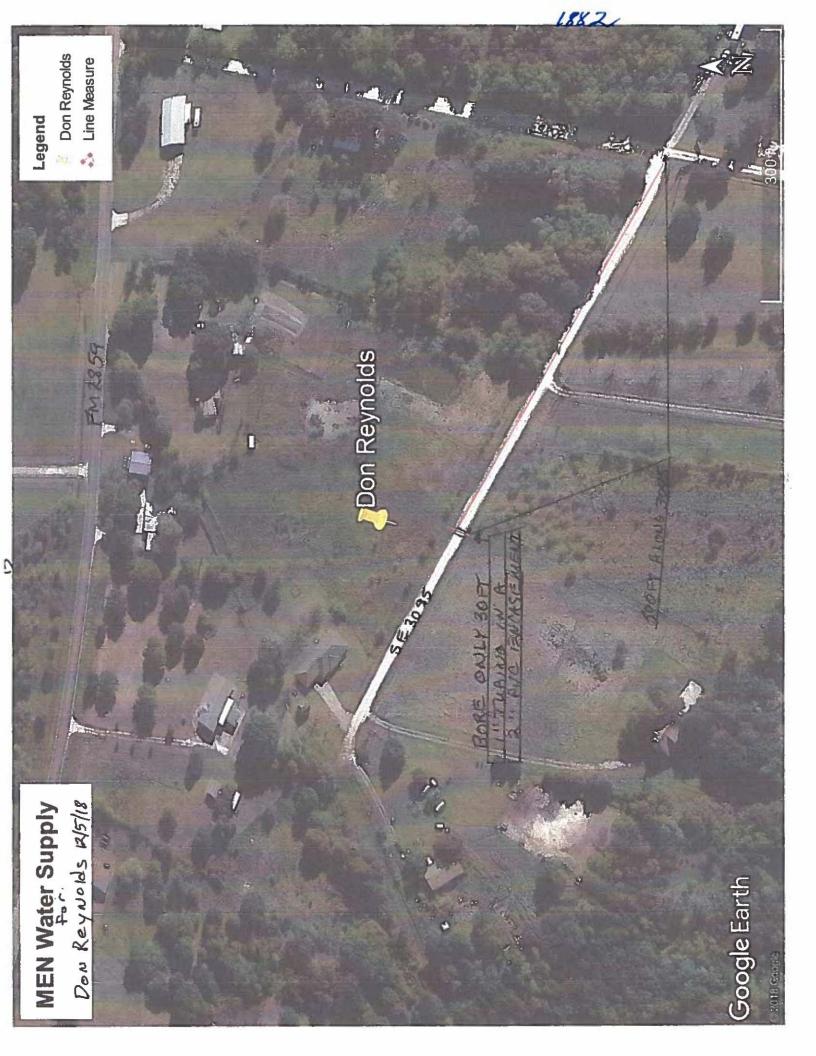
